Data were collected from 26,805,631 people, but healthcare personnel status was only available for 5,055,747 (18.86%) people. For the 507,125 cases of COVID-19 among healthcare personnel, death status was only available for 403,297 (79.53%).





[†]Data will update as soon as they are reviewed and verified, oftentimes before 8 pm ET. However, daily updates might be delayed due to delays in reported data. Data are updated Monday through Saturday.

Healthcare personnel (HCP) are defined as all paid and unpaid persons working in health-care settings who have the potential for exposure to patients and/or to infectious materials, including body substances, contaminated medical supplies and equipment, contaminated environmental surfaces, or contaminated air.

HCP might include, but are not limited to, physicians, nurses, nursing assistants, therapists, technicians, emergency medical service personnel, dental personnel, pharmacists, laboratory personnel, autopsy personnel, students and trainees, contractual staff not employed by the

health-care facility, and persons (e.g., clerical, dietary, environmental services, security, maintenance, administrative, billing, and volunteers) not directly involved in patient care but potentially exposed to infectious agents that can be transmitted to and from HCP and patients.

Some jurisdictions are unable to report healthcare personnel status in their case notification data.
