Accessible Materials and Culturally Relevant Messages for People with Disabilities Project

Populations of focus: People with disabilities, caregivers of people with disabilities, and organizations serving people with disabilities

Purpose: Deliver essential COVID-19 information to people with disabilities, their families, and caregivers. The project helps to ensure that COVID-19 guidelines are not only accessible to people with disabilities, but also that they are culturally appropriate and relevant to the challenges people with disabilities face during emergency response situations such as COVID-19. Afghanistan's Polio Program and Fight Against COVID-19



Populations of focus: Communities in Afghanistan experiencing wild poliovirus

Purpose: Make up for the missed polio vaccinations due to the temporary pause in vaccination campaigns during the early months of the COVID-19 pandemic − a necessary break that helped protect health workers and communities from unnecessary exposure during the pandemic. Learn more

Campaign to Prevent and Control Infectious Diseases Among Migrant Foreign-born Workers in Protein-Processing Industries – Regional Demonstration Project

Population of focus: People who work in protein processing (meat, poultry, and seafood) and have limited English proficiency, as well as their families, in Delaware, Maryland, and Virginia.

Purpose: To improve emergency preparedness and response activities among workers by strengthening partnerships with community-based organizations (CBOs) and increasing CBOs' capacity to address public health emergencies, including pandemics. Learn more


Engaging Faith Leaders to Protect their Congregations and Communities Populations of focus: Faith leaders and faith-based organizations



Project Spotlight: CDC Foundation Southern Alliance



Populations of focus: African American and non-Hispanic Black people in Georgia, Louisiana, and Mississippi

Purpose: To enlist established organizations that reach communities with a high proportion of African American and non-Hispanic Black residents at higher risk for COVID-19 illness and death to adopt and sustain COVID-19 preventive and community mitigation strategies.

Description: CDC Foundation is focused on building the capacity of a "Southern Alliance" of five higher education partners united to increase community prevention of COVID-19 in different subgroups of African American and non-Hispanic Black people in the Southeast. The Alliance has addressed COVID-19 fatigue, misinformation, and lack of access to digital technology and health services by building community trust and key partnerships between the university community, local businesses, faith-based organizations, and other community groups.

Early impact:

- Promoting masking and other mitigation strategies through wide-reaching mass communication initiatives such as The Skin You're In (tsyi.org) ☐ and Mask Up ☐ . Mask Up resulted in almost 500,000 social media post engagements from December 2020 to February 2021.
- Conducting town halls and listening sessions to understand the changing concerns and needs of a community.
- Observing changes in community attitudes about vaccination, including community members in three Mississippi counties shifting from distrust to acceptance. These insights were used to secure additional funding to investigate attitude change in rural African American and non-Hispanic Black communities.
- Mobilizing trusted community messengers to assess miscommunication and mistrust in a community, disseminate culturally appropriate COVID-19 information, and solicit feedback about messaging.
- Training more than 200 community health workers in cultural humility, with content tailored for engaging African American and non-Hispanic Black communities in Louisiana.
- Training future public health professionals by engaging university students in needs assessments and program design.
- Leveraging partnerships with faith-based organizations to guide COVID-19 prevention programming in their communities.
