Milestones

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July 2021 | In its second round of major EHE funding, CDC awards \$117 million to advance innovation and health equity—and help HIV programs regain momentum in the wake of COVID-19.
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December 2020 | EHE jurisdictions submit updated plans by Dec 31st.
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October 2020 | CDC hires and sends seven additional Public Health Field Assignees (total 17) to EHE jurisdictions across the country to increase the HIV workforce capacity of health departments in these areas.
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September 2020 | CDC awards \$109 million to 32 state and local health departments that represent the 57 EHE jurisdictions.*

HHS launches [America's HIV Epidemic Analysis Dashboard \(AHEAD\)](#) [↗](#), a tool that provides national and jurisdictional data from CDC on the six EHE indicators.

CDC awards \$2 million EHE supplemental capacity-building assistance funds to four regional technical assistance providers to assist local areas with community engagement.
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August 2020 | A new investment from the Minority HIV/AIDS Fund (MHAF) aimed to specifically address under-resourced STD clinics. This investment leverages the current CDC-funded [PS20-2004: National Network of Sexually Transmitted Diseases Clinical Prevention Training Centers \(NNPTC\)](#) to bolster training and technical assistance efforts so STD specialty clinics can better provide HIV prevention services. Activities include providing onsite or distance-based (web or phone) consultations, guidance to conduct clinic assessments, in-person site visits, and resources.



January 2020 | CDC continued support for scaling up HIV prevention services in STD specialty clinics with the announcement of the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO): [PS20-2010: Integrated HIV Programs for Health Departments to Support Ending the HIV Epidemic in the United States \(EHE\)](#) to support the development and implementation of programs tailored to ending the HIV epidemic in America. This NOFO is made up of three components; component C is focused on implementing strategies and activities that scale up HIV prevention services to reach populations that access care in STD clinics.



December 2019 | CDC releases an EHE Vital Signs report that highlights the critical need for federal funding to focus on testing, treatment, prevention, and health disparities.



Summer 2019 | CDC awards \$16.5 million from the HHS Minority HIV/AIDS Fund to [three jumpstart sites](#) and to all sites to develop community focused, multi-year EHE plans, with an emphasis on bringing new voices to the table.



February 2019 | *Ending the HIV Epidemic* announced.

* EHE Priority Jurisdictions include the 48 counties, Washington, D.C., San Juan, Puerto Rico, and seven states with a substantial rural burden that account for more than 50% of all new HIV diagnoses in the country.
