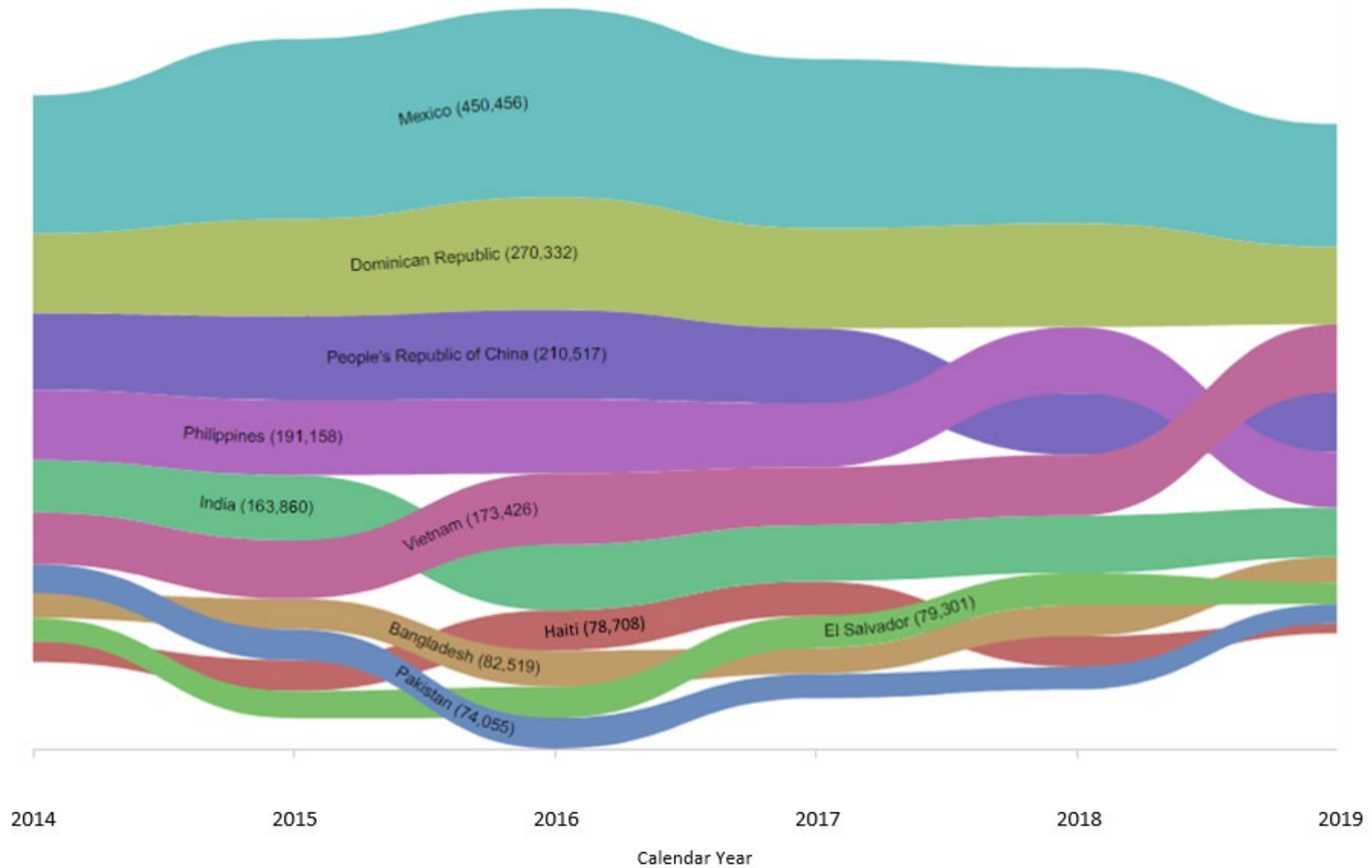


**Supplementary Figure 1. Top ten countries of nationality for new-arrival immigrants\* by year of arrival, 2014-2019.**

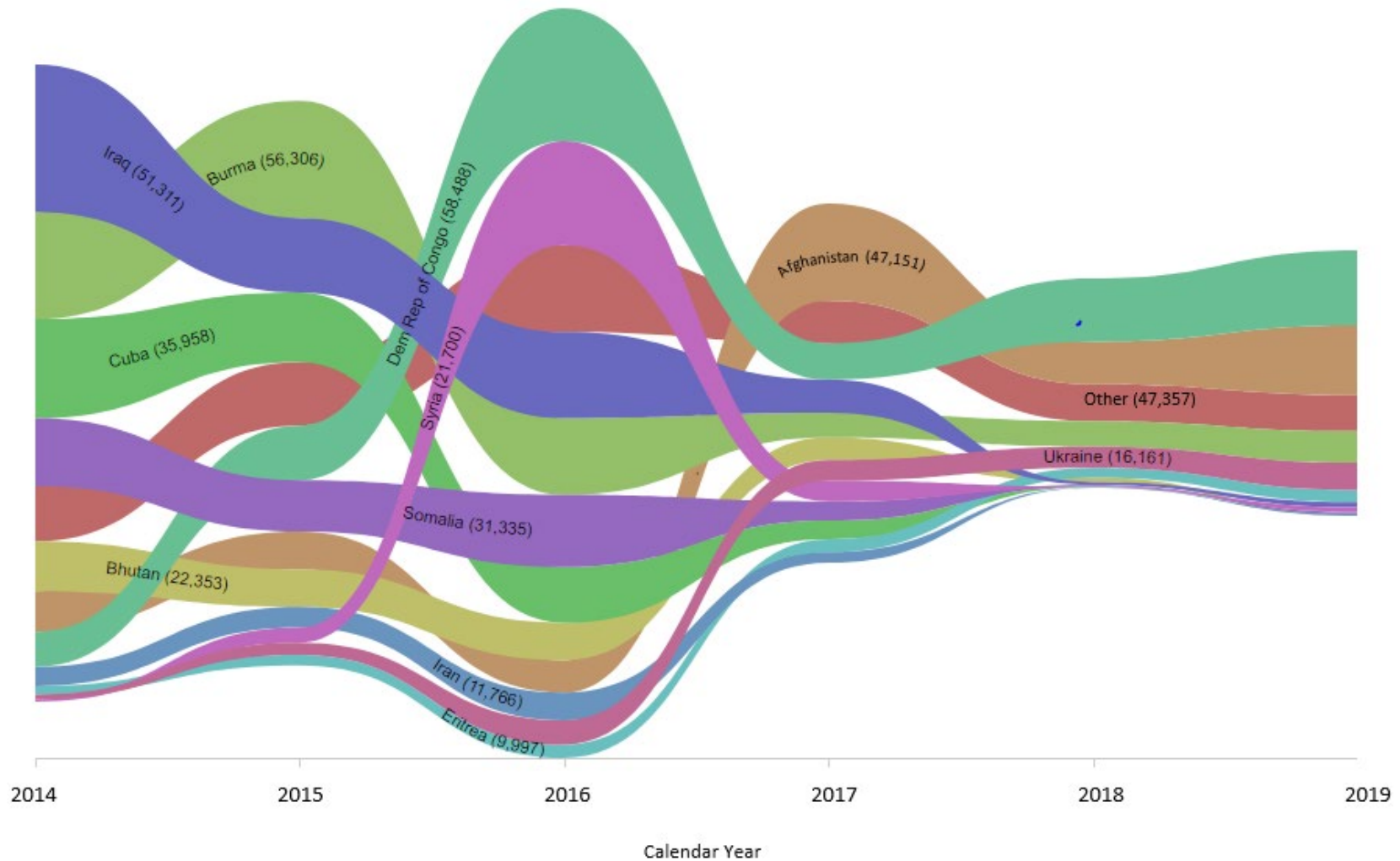


**Series Key**

\* New-arrival immigrants are persons who, while abroad, completed the application process for lawful permanent residency in the United States.

\* Refugees are persons unable or unwilling to return to their country of nationality because of persecution, or a well-founded fear of persecution, resulting from their race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion. Eligible others are persons admitted from abroad, other than refugees, who are eligible for services from the Office of Refugee Resettlement (primarily parolees, Iraqi and Afghan special immigrant visa holders, and follow-to-join asylees).
