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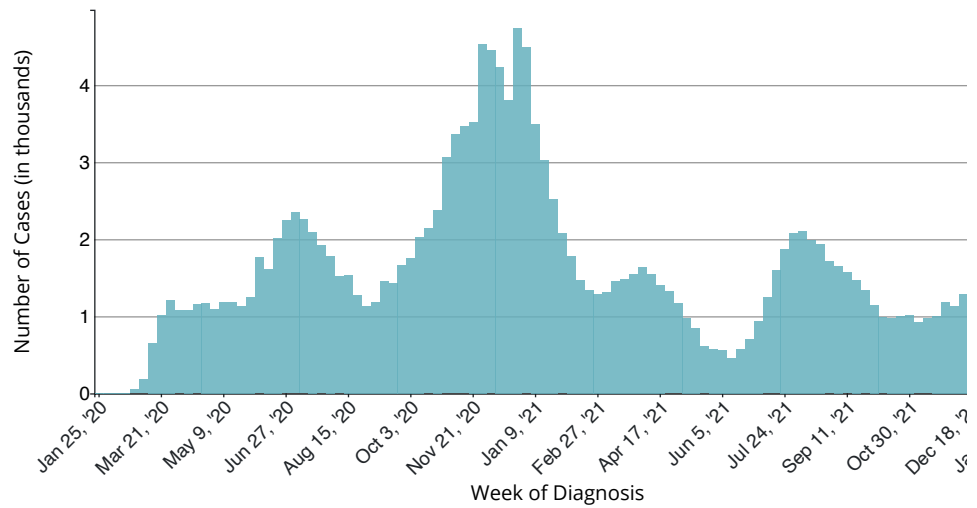

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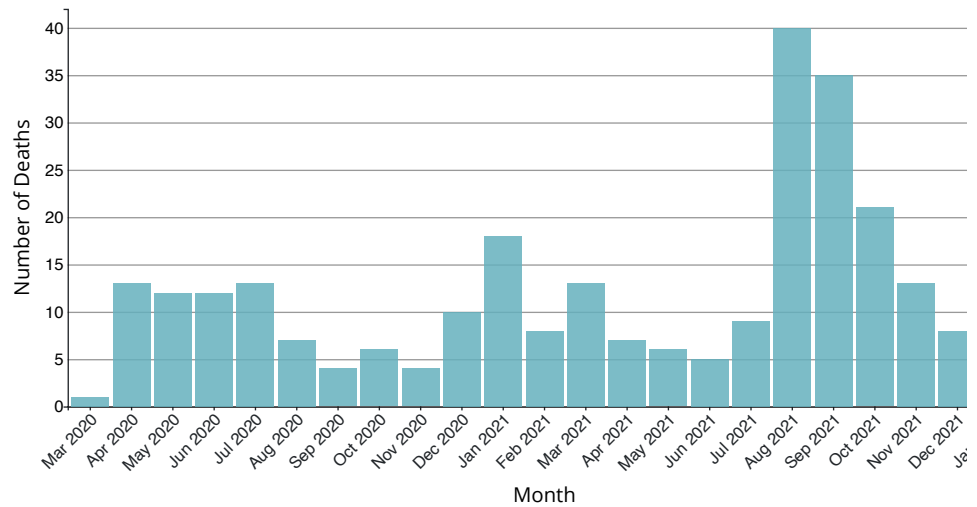

Date of death is use reporting, and if missing, then date of diagnosis is used. Delays may exist in reporting of deaths from initial confirmation of SARS-CoV-2 infection.

** In July 2021, the Delta variant of SARS-CoV-2 became the predominant variant in the United States.

Pregnant Women with COVID-19 Who Were Hospitalized United States, January 22, 2020 - January 31, 2022

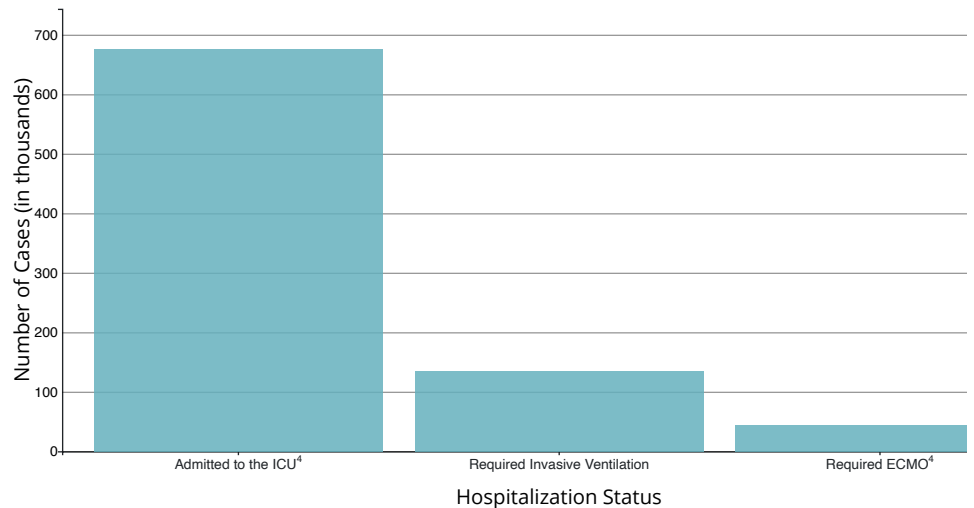

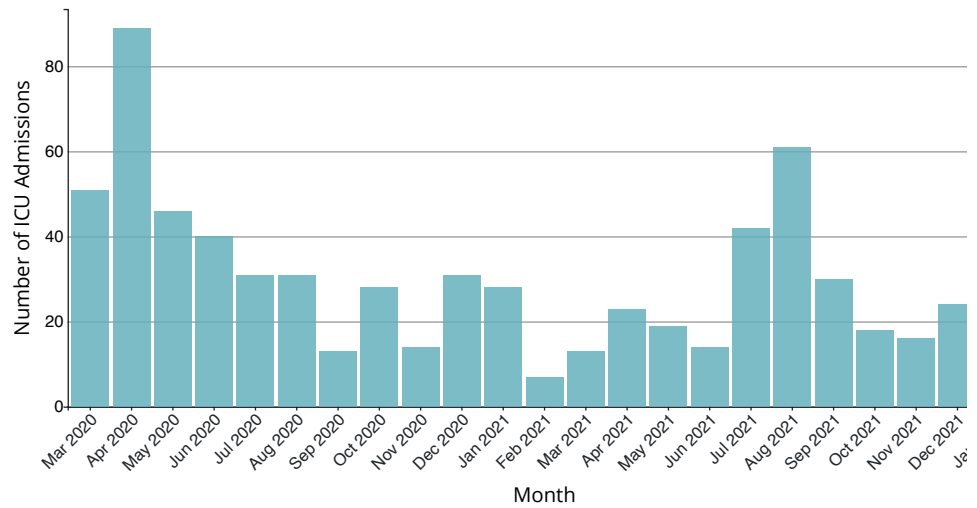

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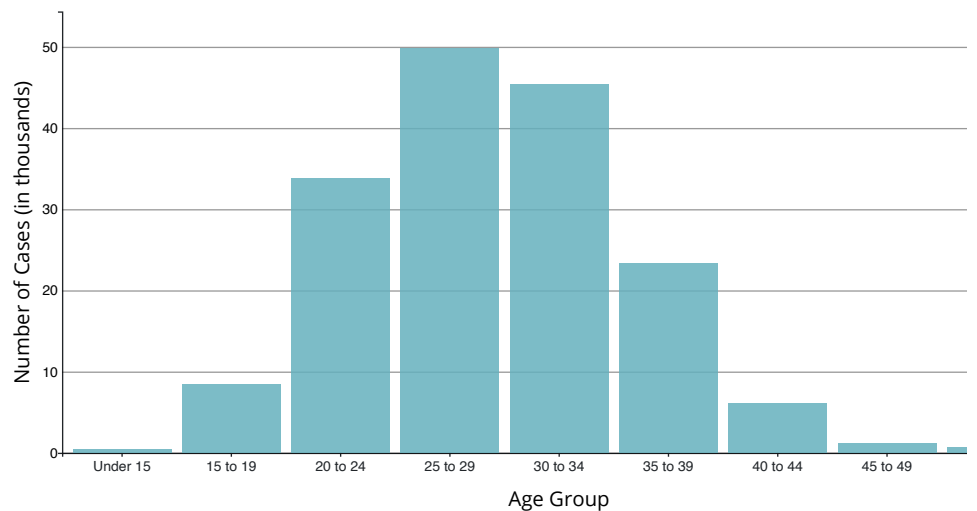
Intensive Care Unit (ICU) Admissions among Pregnant Women with COVID-19 by Month

Data were collected from 169,407 women, but ICU admission data were only available for (10.5%) women.


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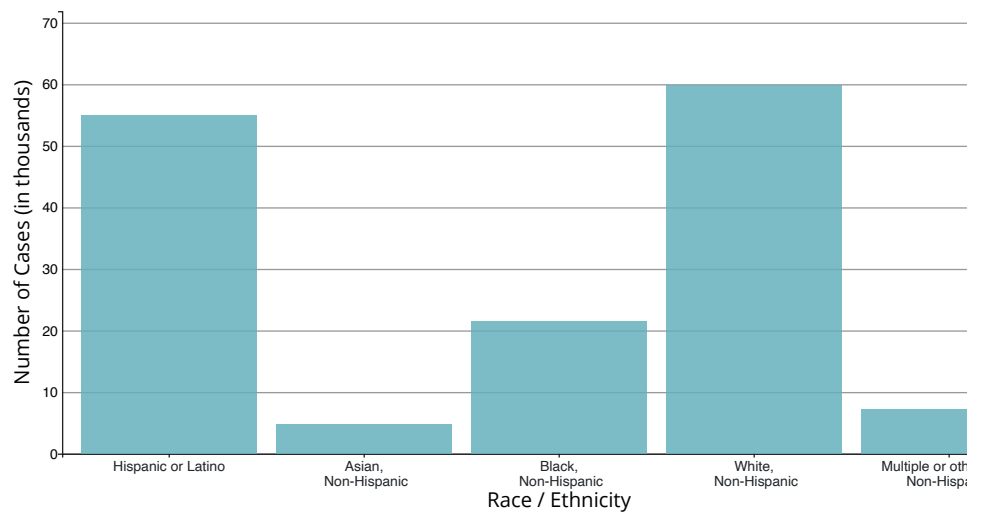
Pregnant Women with COVID-19 by Age, United States, Jan 22, 2020 - January 31, 2022

⁴Abbreviation: ICU, intensive care unit; ECMO, extracorporeal membrane oxygenation, an advanced life support technique used for patients with life-threatening heart and/or lung problems.
