2022 HHS CPG Module Training to Be Held in December

The 2022 HHS Capabilities Planning Guide (CPG) module is now open in PERFORMS. The CPG module provides a platform for PHEP and Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) recipients to self-assess their current programs across the CDC and ASPR preparedness and response capabilities. CPG data is intended to guide preparedness investments by helping jurisdictions identify preparedness capability gaps.

PHEP recipients should use their CPG data to help inform their strategic priorities and PHEP Budget Period 4 work plan objectives and planned activities. PHEP CPG data are due **January 31, 2022**. However, CDC strongly encourages early review and submission of CPG data.

CDC's PERFORMS team will present training sessions on the CPG module at **11 a.m. EST on Wednesday**, **December 1**, and at **2 p.m. EST on Thursday**, **December 2**. The same information will be presented during each session. Following is the participant information for both sessions.

CDC Expands Eligibility for COVID-19 Booster Shots to All Adults

On November 19, CDC Director Dr. Rochelle P. Walensky endorsed the CDC Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices' (ACIP) <u>expanded recommendations for booster shots</u> to include all adults ages 18 years and older who received a Pfizer-BioNTech or a Moderna vaccine at least six months after their second doses. CDC's PHEP Connects Webinar Scheduled for December 8 CDC's next PHEP Connects webinar is scheduled for 1 p.m. EST on Wednesday, December 8. The December webinar, "How Disaster



Epidemiology Tools and Methods Meet Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response Capabilities," will highlight how disaster epidemiology aligns with CDC's capability standards and integrates with emergency management.

Tess Konen, senior epidemiologist at the Minnesota Department of Health and co-chair of the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE) Disaster Epidemiology Subcommittee, will define disaster epidemiology (DE) and its role in all phases of the emergency management cycle and provide an overview of how DE tools and methods align with CDC's preparedness and response capability standards. The presentation will describe specific tools and resources, such as Community Assessment for Public Health Emergency Response (CASPER) and Emergency Responder Health Monitoring and Surveillance (ERHMS) and provide local and state examples of how agencies can integrate DE into their preparedness plans and responses.

Andrew Adams, CSTE senior program analyst, will also share disaster epidemiology resources and how to access CSTE technical assistance resources. Following is the participant information.
