

# Understandin g Opioids

<sup>®</sup> Opioids are drugs that interact with opioid receptors on nerve cells in the body and brain

<sup>®</sup>Common opioids:



您Prescription drugs like oxycodone, hydrocodone, codeine, morphine
您Heroin
您Synthetic opioids like fentanyl and carfentanil

<sup>®</sup> Opioids have high potential for addiction and overdose








### Opioids and CDC

#### **Three Waves of the Rise in Opioid Overdose Deaths**



- <sup>#</sup>Long-term use of prescription or illicit opioids can lead to an opioid use disorder, commonly known as addiction
- <sup>®</sup>Opioid overdose deaths have been increasing steadily since 1999



Opioid Use Disorder and CDC <sup>#</sup>How can we reduce deaths due to opioid overdose? <sup>烟</sup>Recognize signs of overdose <sup>®</sup> Small, constricted "pinpoint pupils" <sup>®</sup> Falling asleep or loss of consciousness <sup>®</sup> Slow, shallow breathing <sup>®</sup> Choking or gurgling sounds <sup>®</sup> Limp body <sup>®</sup> Pale, blue, or cold skin <sup>烟</sup>Passing 911 Good Samaritan Laws <sup>烟</sup>Using naloxone to reverse overdoses <sup>烟</sup>Medication-assisted treatment (MAT) <sup>您</sup>Syringe service programs


