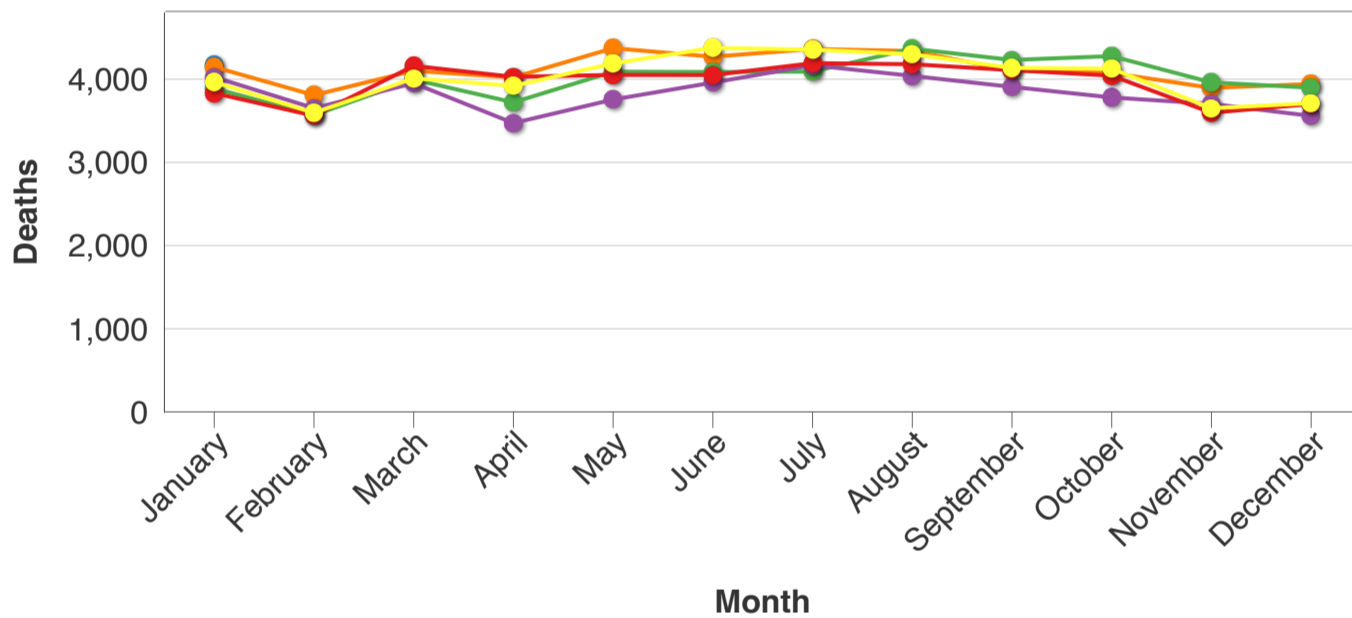
Fatal Injury Trends
