




Terrestrial Rabies Reservoirs in the United States, 2010




Rabies in Wild Animals, 1961-2011






Rabid Bats Reported in the United States during 2011







Rabid Skunks Reported in the United States during 2011






Rabid Cats and Dogs Reported in the United States during 2011
