

Data Visualization: Recent NCIPC Funding History



Text Description

- FY 2018: NCIPC's budget increased by \$362.5 million largely driven by a \$350 million increase in opioid overdose prevention funds.
- FY 2020: NCPIC received new budget lines, including Firearm Injury and Mortality Prevention Research, Suicide Prevention, and Adverse Childhood Experiences.
- FY 2021: NCIPC's budget rose to \$682.879 million due to increases ranging from \$500 thousand to \$2 million to several existing budget lines.
- FY2022: NCIPC's budget increased \$32 million in FY 2022, with additions to six existing lines and the creation of a new

line for drowning prevention.

• FY 2023: The FY 2023 budget for NCIPC rose by almost \$50 million with increases to most budget lines and continued emphasis in Suicide Prevention and Opioid Overdose Prevention and Surveillance.
