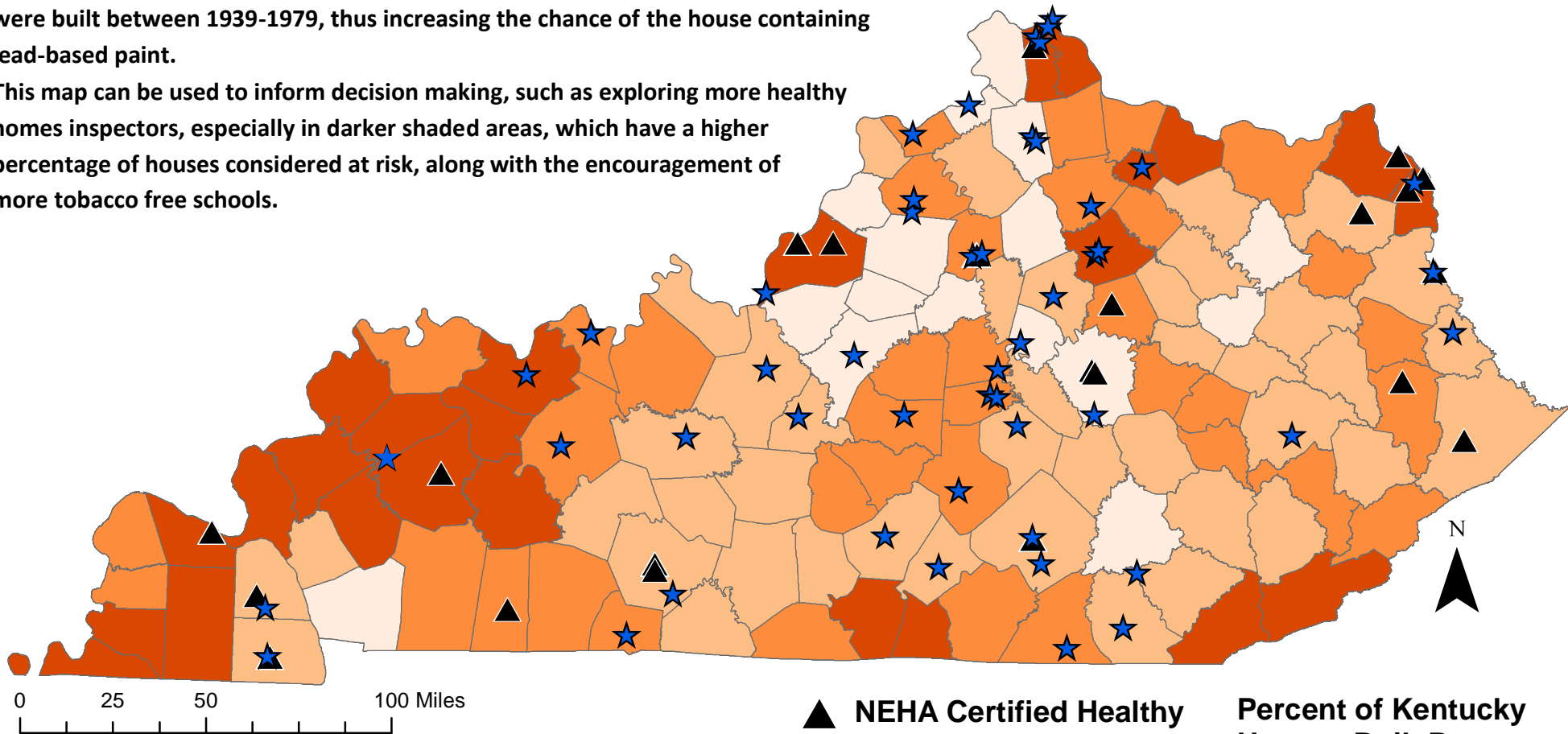


# Children in Kentucky: Analyzing Indicators for Improved Health

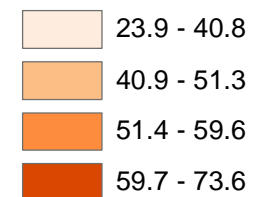
- The goal of this map was to examine indicators that could have an impact on the health of children in Kentucky.
- Darker graduated colors on the map represent a greater percentage of houses that were built between 1939-1979, thus increasing the chance of the house containing lead-based paint.
- This map can be used to inform decision making, such as exploring more healthy homes inspectors, especially in darker shaded areas, which have a higher percentage of houses considered at risk, along with the encouragement of more tobacco free schools.
