Rapid Testing Support: Distributing Testing Supplies

ELC is working with jurisdictional partners to allocate 5 million rapid, point-of-care and over the counter tests per month to schools (up to 1.25 million tests per week). All ELC recipients can submit prioritized requests to CDC on a weekly basis for high-need school districts and camps serving K–12 students that can put these tests to use immediately. CDC is allocating available tests each week based on the prioritized lists of school districts from ELC recipients (64 state, local, and territorial health departments), social vulnerability index, and feasibility of immediately implementing testing to address a critical gap and sustain in-person education.
