### **RESOURCE HIGHLIGHTS: Data Equity and Sharing**

These resource highlights are designed to feature topics that are of interest to OT21-2103 grant recipients as a part of the *National Initiative to Address COVID-19 Health Disparities Among Populations at High-Risk and Underserved, Including Racial and Ethnic Minority Populations and Rural Communities.* This month's resource highlights focuses on data equity and sharing.

### **Learning and Action in Policy and Partnerships**

The Learning and Action in Policy Partnerships (LAPP) initiative is a joint effort between Data Across Sectors for Health (DASH) and the Center for Health Care Strategies (CHCS). LAPP works with communities to enhance their datasharing capabilities and forge new partnerships between state governments, community-based partners, and individual community members.

### National Commission to Transform Public Health Data Systems

The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation formed the National Commission to Transform Public Health Data Systems in response to the health inequalities and insufficient cross-sector data-sharing capabilities that characterize the American health care system. The 16-member Commission, comprised of experts from the healthcare, community advocacy, business, government, and public health spaces, was tasked with examining the data and data-sharing systems needed to ensure a public health system that is representative of the situations and needs of all Americans.

### **The Data Modernization Initiative (DMI)**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention created the Data Modernization Initiative (DMI) in 2020 with the goal of developing a united, modernized American public health community capable of swiftly and accurately detecting and responding to health threats. The initiative connects public and private sector partners with the vision of moving away from the siloed public health data systems of today towards connected, adaptable, sustainable "response-ready" systems that mitigate the harm caused by future health crises.

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### <u>Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion in Public Health Data</u> <u>Modernization</u>

Historically, research data and collection has been misrepresented, disregarding communities of color especially during a public health crisis. This article describes how accurate public health data is essential to gauge adequate and equitable interventions, evaluations, and engagement that address the root cause of health inequities.

## The Search for Good Data to Support Health Equity in Public Health

This article elevates case examples of ASTHO's Diverse Executives Leading in Public Health (DELPH) subject matter experts utilizing data to achieve health equity in their respective health departments.
