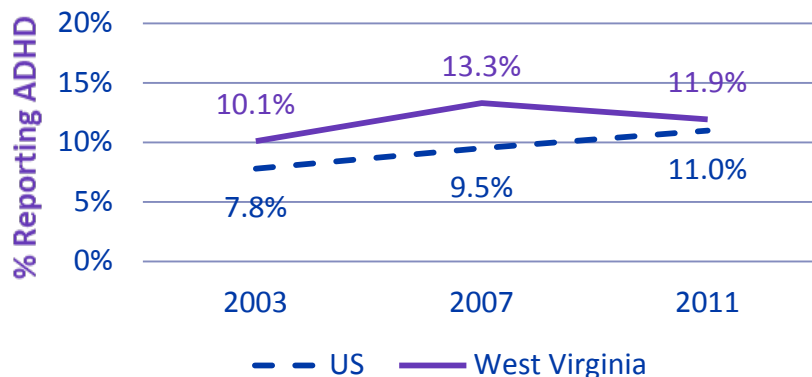

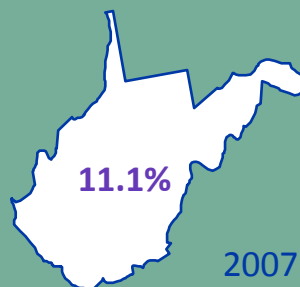
Survey Question

Has a doctor or health care provider **ever** told you that your child had attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder or attention deficit disorder (**ADHD or ADD**)?



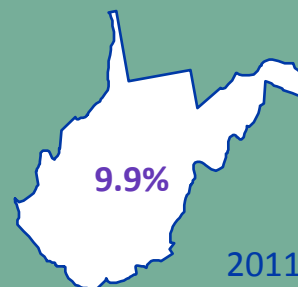
Does your child **currently** have ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 7.2% of US children and 11.1% of children in West Virginia had **current** ADHD, by parent report.



Among all US states, West Virginia ranked 3rd highest.

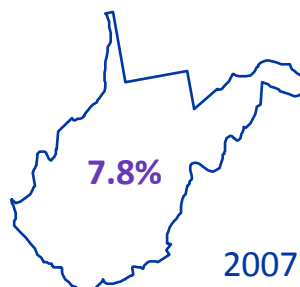
In 2011, 8.8% of US children and 9.9% of children in West Virginia had **current** ADHD, by parent report.



Among all US states, West Virginia ranked 19th highest.

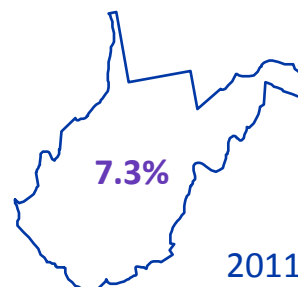
Is your child **currently** taking medication for ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 4.8% of US children and 7.8% of children in West Virginia were taking medication for ADHD.



Among all US states, West Virginia ranked 3rd highest.

In 2011, 6.1% of US children and 7.3% of children in West Virginia were taking medication for ADHD.



Among all US states, West Virginia ranked 16th highest.
