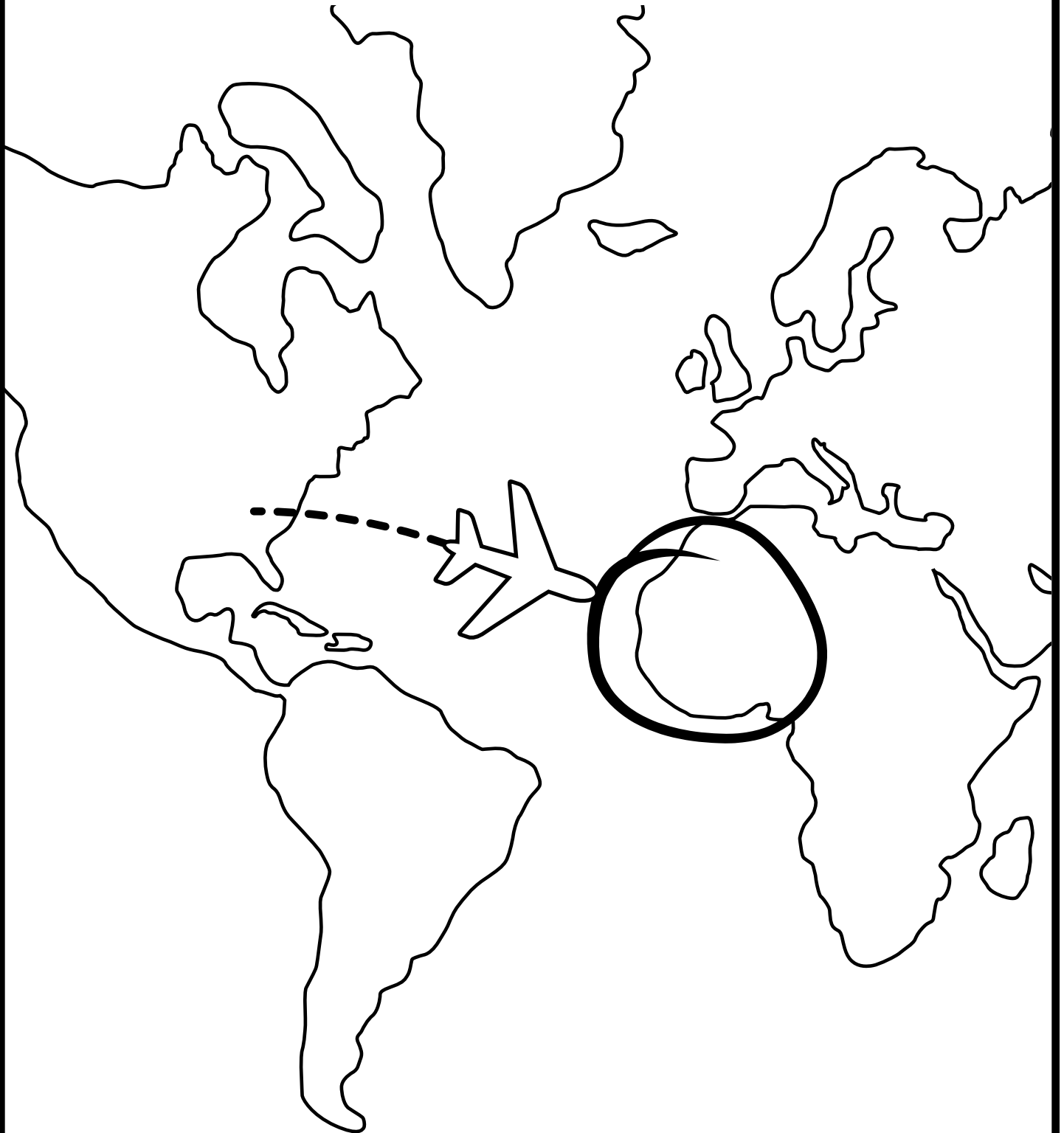

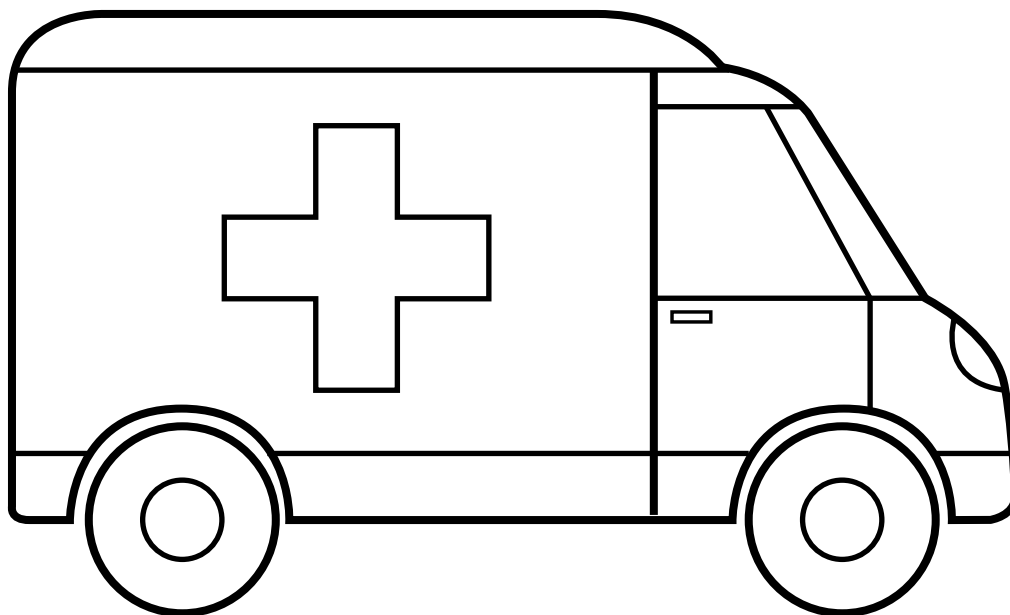
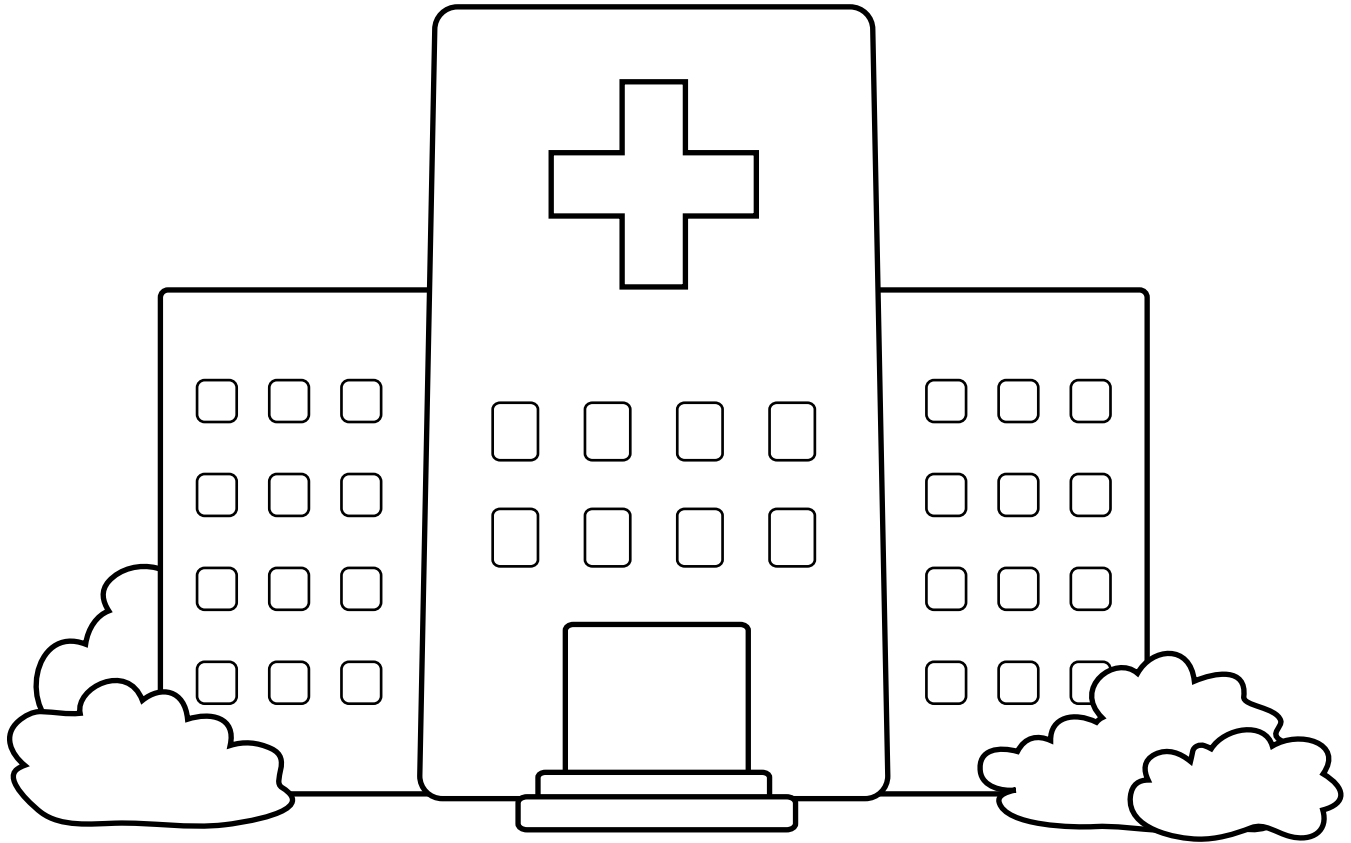
Note to Parents

Daddy is going to West Africa for a few weeks to help stop more people from getting sick.

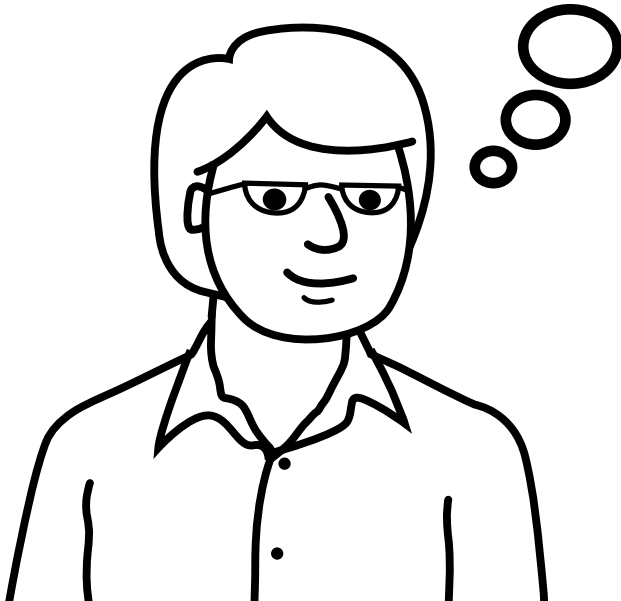
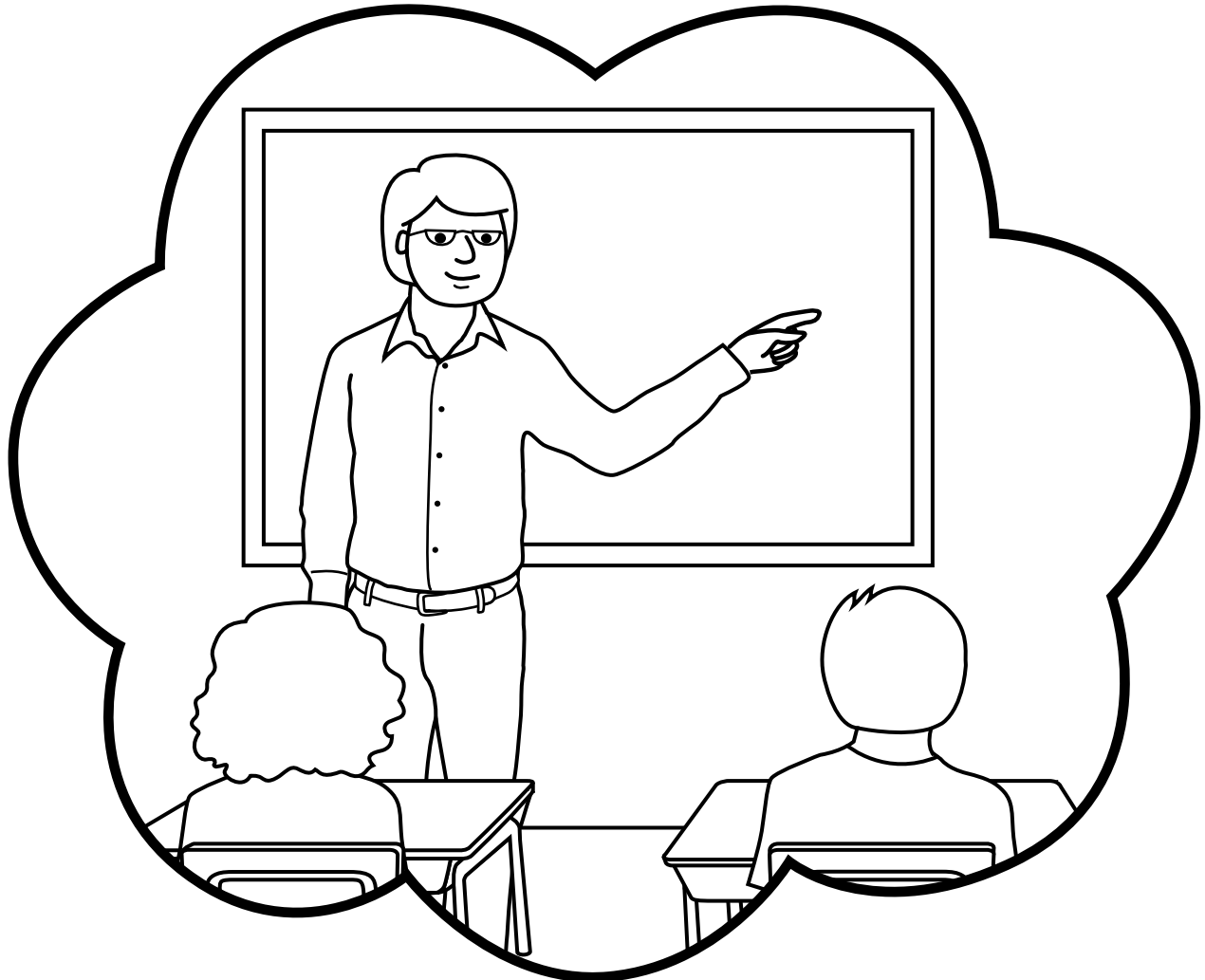


HE IS A HERO!

Ebola is spread when the spit, blood, sweat, poop, or pee of a sick person gets in the eyes, nose, mouth, or cuts of a healthy person. Only a person sick with Ebola can make another person sick. People in Africa cannot get Ebola from the air, water, or food.



In West Africa, Daddy will make sure sick people go to the hospital for help. He will also teach people how to protect themselves from Ebola and stay healthy.

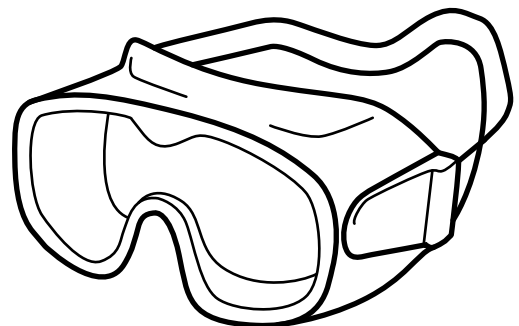
Daddy will have special clothes and tools to keep him extra safe.

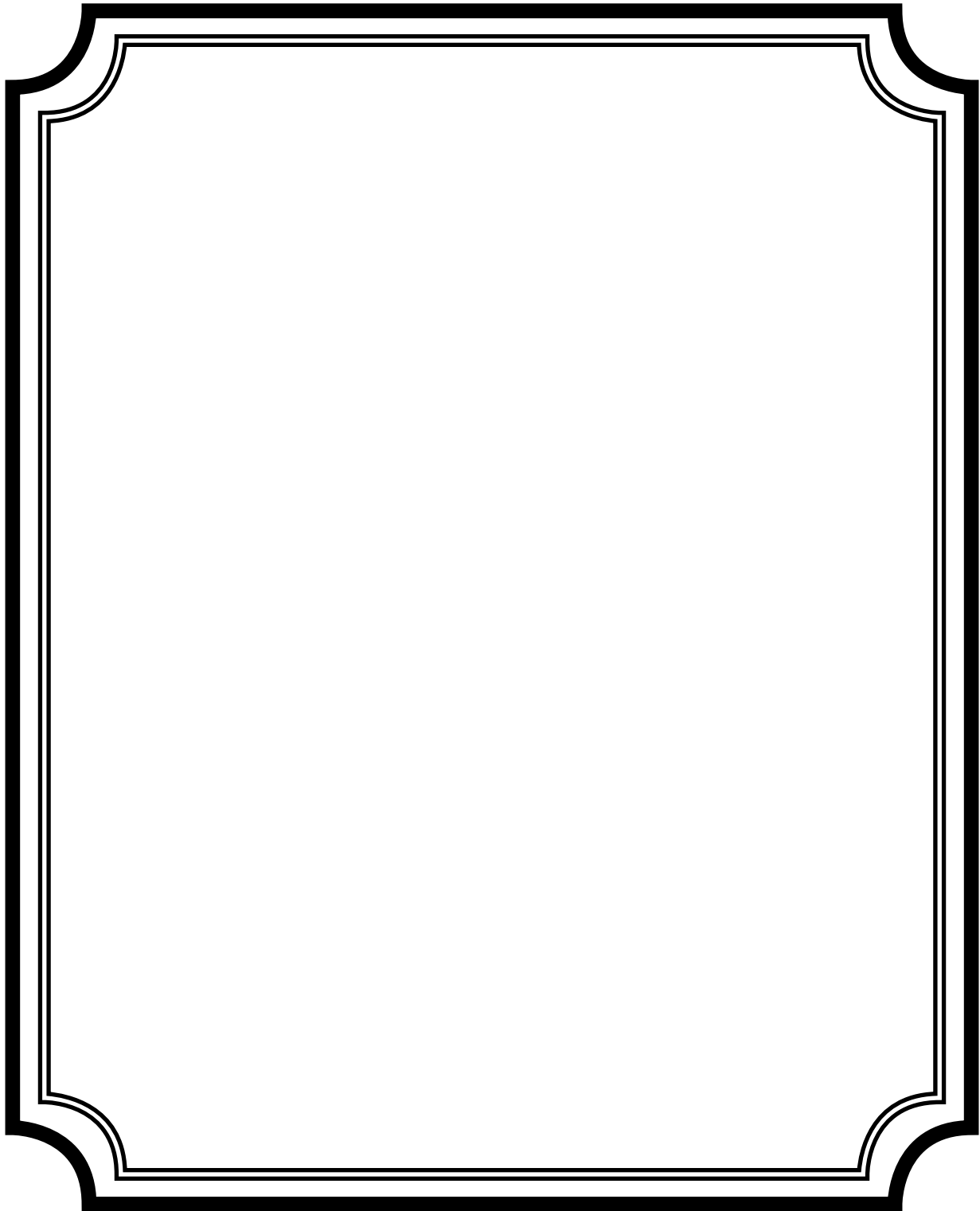
As Daddy gets ready to leave, you can help him pack his suitcase. Give him a “good luck charm” to remind him of you!

Color the items Daddy needs to pack for his trip.

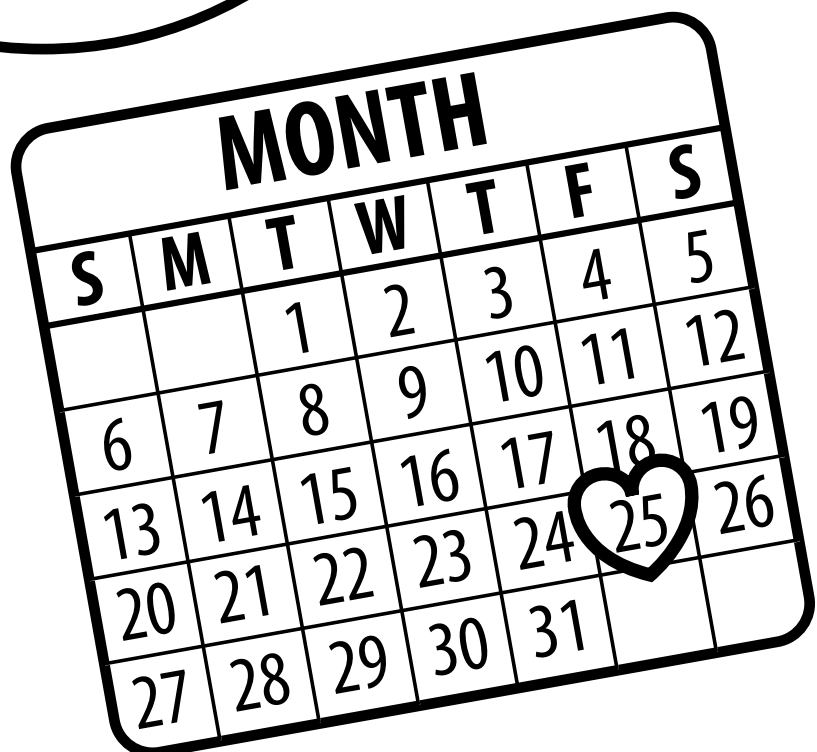
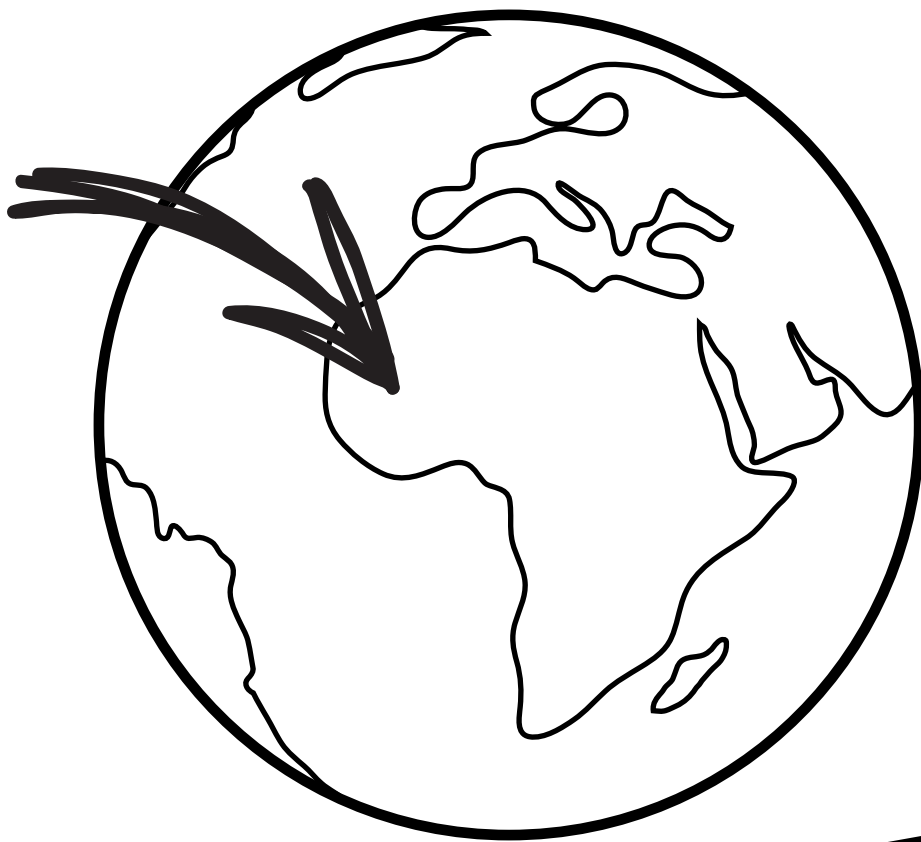


Daddy will miss you so much when he is gone. Give him lots of hugs and kisses before he leaves.
