

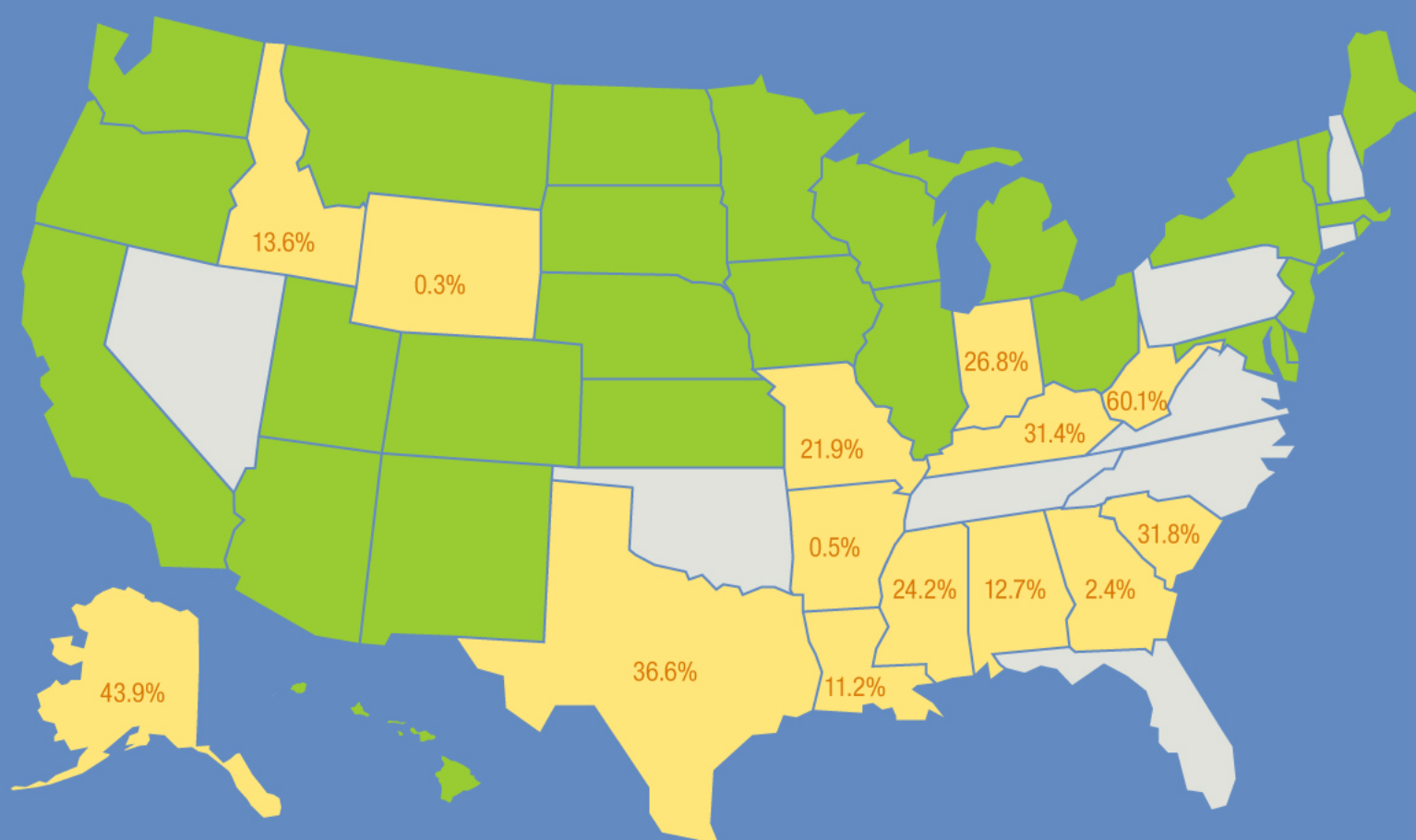
Southeast States are Lacking Comprehensive Smoke-Free Air Laws



Percent of Population Covered by a State or Local Comprehensive Smoke-Free Law*

*Comprehensive smoke-free laws prohibit smoking in all indoor areas of worksites and restaurants and bars.



Overall, nearly

60%

of Americans are now covered by comprehensive smoke-free laws at the state or local level.

Number of states with statewide comprehensive smoke-free laws increased from

Zero in 2000 to **27** and DC by June 2016.

Despite this progress,

only two

states (North Dakota and California) have implemented statewide comprehensive smoke-free laws since 2010.
