<sup>†</sup> Transgender identity was categorized as transgender for those who responded, "Yes, I am transgender" to "Some people describe themselves as transgender when their sex at birth does not match the way they think or feel about their gender. Are you transgender?" Questioning are those who responded, "I am not sure if I am transgender." Cisgender are those who responded, "No, I am not transgender." Since the sex question does not specify sex assigned at birth, there may be differences in interpretation among transgender students. For this reason, only cisgender students are further disaggregated by sex.
