Appendix Table 1. Twelve signs and symptoms for self-reported traumatic brain injury

Probable TBI	Possible TBI
Difficulty remembering what happened just before or after injury	Dazed, confused, or trouble thinking straight
Loss of consciousness	Nausea or vomiting
Three or more symptoms from Possible TBI	Headache
	Dizzy, clumsy, or balance problems
	Blurred or double vision
	Trouble concentrating
	Difficulty learning or remembering new things
	Sensitivity to light or noise
	Change in mood or temperament
	Change in sleep or more tired than usual

Probable TBIs were those in which the child sustained a head injury and experienced difficulty remembering, loss of consciousness, or three or more symptoms from the “possible TBI” tier.
