Mongolia - Dental Students (3rd Year Students Only) Global Health Professions Student Survey (GHPSS)

The Mongolia dental students GHPSS includes data on prevalence of cigarette smoking and use of other tobacco products, knowledge and attitudes about tobacco use, exposure to second-hand smoke, desire for smoking cessation, and training received during dental school regarding patient counseling on smoking cessation techniques. This information could be very useful in monitoring and developing Mongolia's comprehensive tobacco control program. The Mongolia dental students GHPSS was a census of 3rd year dental students attending the 2 dental schools in Mongolia conducted in 2007. The school response rate was 100% and the student response rate was 100%. A total of 139 students participated in the Mongolia dental students GHPSS.
