Costa Rica Global School Personnel Survey (GSPS)

FACT SHEET

The Costa Rica GSPS includes data on prevalence of cigarette and other tobacco use as well as information on attitudes on school policy toward tobacco use, access to teaching materials and training, and attitudes toward tobacco use. These factors are components Costa Rica could include in a comprehensive tobacco control program.

The Costa Rica GSPS was a school-based survey of school personnel from the schools that participated in the 2008 Costa Rica GYTS.

The GYTS was conducted in schools having students in grades 7th, 8th, and 9th. For the GYTS, a two-stage cluster sample design was used to produce representative data for all of Costa Rica. At the first stage, schools were selected with probability proportional to enrollment size. At the second stage, classes were randomly selected and all students in selected classes were eligible to participate. The school response rate was 57.8%. For the GSPS, 42.8% of the school personnel completed the survey, for a total of 1,047 teachers and administrators.

Prevalence of Tobacco Use among School Personnel

48.3% ever smoked cigarettes (Admin = 50.0%, Teachers = 48.3%)

20.9% currently use any tobacco product (Admin = 41.7%, Teachers = 20.4%)

14.0% currently smoke cigarettes (Admin = 29.2%, Teachers = 13.7%)

9.5% currently use other tobacco products (Admin = 11.5%, Teachers = 9.4%)

5.7% smoked on school property in the past year (Admin = 7.4%, Teachers = 5.6%)

School Policies Prohibiting Tobacco Use

70.4% report school has policy prohibiting tobacco use among students 37.1% report school has a policy prohibiting tobacco use among personnel

Access to Teaching Materials and Training

95.5% think teachers need specific training to help students avoid tobacco use

38.2% teachers have access to teaching materials on tobacco use

11.5% teachers had ever received training on youth tobacco use prevention

12.2% schools use non-classroom programs to teach youth tobacco use prevention

Attitudes

99.4% think smoke from others is harmful to them

82.8% think tobacco product advertising should be completely banned

81.4% think the price of tobacco products should be increased

89.7% think the tobacco industry deliberately encourages youth to use tobacco

Highlights

- 20.9% of school personnel currently use any tobacco product; 14.0% currently smoke cigarettes and 9.5% currently use other tobacco products.
- Seven in 10 schools have a policy prohibiting tobacco use among students; Nearly two in five have a policy for personnel.
- More than one-third of the teachers have access to teaching materials on tobacco use.
- Over 1 in 10 teachers have ever received training on youth tobacco use prevention.
- More than 1 in 10 schools use non-classroom programs to teach youth tobacco use prevention.
