Nepal - Dental Students 2011 (3rd Year Students Only) Global Health Professions Student Survey (GHPSS)

FACT SHEET .

The Nepal Dental students GHPSS includes data on prevalence of cigarette smoking and use of other tobacco products, knowledge and attitudes about tobacco use, exposure to secondhand smoke, desire for smoking cessation, and training received during Dental school regarding patient counseling on smoking cessation techniques. This information could be very useful in monitoring and developing Nepal's comprehensive tobacco control program. The Nepal Dental students GHPSS was a census of 3rd year Dental students attending 4 Dental schools in Nepal conducted in 2011. A total of 115 students participated in the Nepal Dental students GHPSS out of which 73 were 3rd year students. The overall response rate of all Dental students surveyed was 83.9%.
