"Remember Wilberg" is a documentary produced by UTA's Department of Art and Art History about a December 1984 fire at the Wilberg Mine in Emery County, Utah. The fire killed 27 coal miners.

The documentary took more than two years to produce. While it honors the victims of the disaster, it will also be used as a safety training tool for coal miners. A \$1.3 million federal grant that was awarded to UTA's Division of Enterprise Development funded the project.

Working with the *University of Texas, Arlington*, our consulting services group, *Safety Solutions International* was the major servicer under a grant awarded by the *National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health* (NIOSH) that provided the funding to produce a documentary titled, *Remember Wilberg*. It is 60 minutes in length and is intended for new and experienced miners or other employees working in mining or other high-hazard work environments, especially members of mine rescue and emergency response teams.

The film tells a story of courage, loss, and resilience. This underground coal mine fire occurred in Emery County, Utah over 30 years ago and took the lives of 27 miners. The majority of storytellers profiled in the documentary were members of mine rescue crews called in to help during the fire. The experiences they share are as powerful and vivid today as they were 30 years ago.
