Teachers and school staff using cleaning products, sanitizers, and disinfectants may experience asthma, eye injury, skin rashes, and headaches. Chemicals found in these products can also lead to reproductive harm and cancer. The Work-Related Asthma Prevention Program produced the video about their Cleaning for Asthma-Safe Schools Microfiber Project. Teachers share how this simple, safe, and effective cleaning alternative has decreased their chemical exposure. Children also clean their own desks with a cloth dampened with water, contributing to a healthier classroom environment. Narration covers California laws and regulations about using sanitizers and disinfectants in the classroom.
