NC: Not calculated—There is insufficient data available to support the calculation of this statistic.

Cum: Cumulative Year-to-Date (YTD) counts.

* Case counts for reporting years 2025 and 2026 are provisional and subject to change. Cases are assigned to the reporting jurisdiction submitting the case to NNDSS, if the case's country of usual residence is the U.S., a U.S. territory, unknown, or null (i.e., country not reported); otherwise, the case is assigned to the 'Non-U.S. Residents' category. Country of usual residence is currently not reported by all jurisdictions or for all conditions. † Previous 52 week maximum and cumulative YTD are determined from periods of time when the condition was reportable in the jurisdiction (i.e., may be less than 52 weeks of data or incomplete YTD data).

§ Beginning in January 2023, cases began to be reported as Carbapenemase-Producing Organisms, clinical or Carbapenemase-Producing Organisms, screening. In previous years, only Carbapenemase-Producing Carbapenem-Resistant *Enterobacteriaceae* (CP-CRE) cases were reported.

¶ CPO (total) includes CP-CRE cases reported in MMWR year 2023, and CPO clinical and CPO screening cases reported in both MMWR years 2023 and 2024.

Notes:

- These are **weekly** cases of selected infectious national notifiable diseases, from the National Notifiable Diseases Surveillance System (NNDSS). NNDSS data reported by the 50 states, New York City, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. territories are collated and published weekly in alphabetical order by condition. Cases reported by jurisdiction health departments to CDC for weekly publication are subject to ongoing revision of information and delayed reporting. Therefore, numbers listed in later weeks may reflect changes made to these counts as additional information becomes available. Case counts in the tables are presented as published each week.
