Third Annual HAI Grantees Meeting at CDC

The third annual HAI Grantees Meeting is being held in Atlanta at the CDC Roybal campus on October 20th and 21st. This meeting will provide updates on the progress of state HAI prevention efforts and related activities, as well as future directions toward HAI elimination. In addition, the conference will provide the opportunity for state HAI Coordinators to continue to collaborate with coordinators from other states and key public health partners.

Inpatient Prospective Payment Systems (IPPS) Final Rule

On August 1, 2011, the IPPS Final Rule was posted on the [Office of the Federal Register Website](#). This rule makes final the reporting requirements for [surgical site infections \(SSI\)](#) associated with colon and abdominal hysterectomy procedures, as well as [catheter-associated urinary tract infections \(CAUTI\)](#) from acute care hospitals. The rule takes effect January 2012. It also finalizes reporting requirements for [MRSA bacteremia](#), [C. difficile](#) LabID Events, and healthcare worker Influenza vaccination from acute care hospitals starting in January 2013. In addition, the rule makes final the reporting of CAUTIs from inpatient rehabilitation facilities starting in October 2012.

Emergency Water Supply Planning (EWSP) Guide for Hospitals and Healthcare Facilities

Healthcare facilities are a critical component to a community's response and recovery following an emergency or disaster such as an earthquake, hurricane, or fire. The resiliency of the community depends on healthcare facilities and other critical infrastructure sectors to maintain their water capabilities during these incidents.

CDC's Healthy Water Program recently released the [Emergency Water Supply Planning \(EWSP\) Guide for Hospitals and Healthcare Facilities](#). This comprehensive and detailed guide, developed through a collaborative effort between the [American Water Works Association](#) and CDC, was created to help healthcare facilities develop a robust emergency water supply plan as part of their overall Emergency Operations Plans.
