PROVISIONAL INFORMATION ON SELECTED NOTIFIABLE DISEASES IN THE UNITED STATES AND ON DEATHS IN SELECTED CITIES FOR WEEK ENDED SEPTEMBER 15, 1962

POLIOMYELITIS - The week which ended September 15, 1962, brought reports of 29 cases of poliomyelitis (21 paralytic). This is below the previous week's total of 30 cases, 25 of which were paralytic. The persistence of the unusually low level of case occurrence is apparent when these totals are compared with the figures received for the corresponding week in 1961 when 98 cases (63 paralytic) were reported.

Of the eleven States reporting paralytic cases this week, only California, Nebraska, and Texas reported over two cases. In California, all of the cases were from

Los Angeles County; however, only two were from Pasadena, where Type I oral polio vaccine was used as an epidemic deterrent. These cases had onset before the oral vaccine was administered. The remaining cases from Los Angeles County were scattered geographically.

The cases from Nebraska represent delayed reports while in Texas no new case concentrations have been noted.

The poliomyelitis incidence for the United States in 1962 is the lowest ever reported. The cumulative totals for the nation from the 1st through the 37th week in 1962

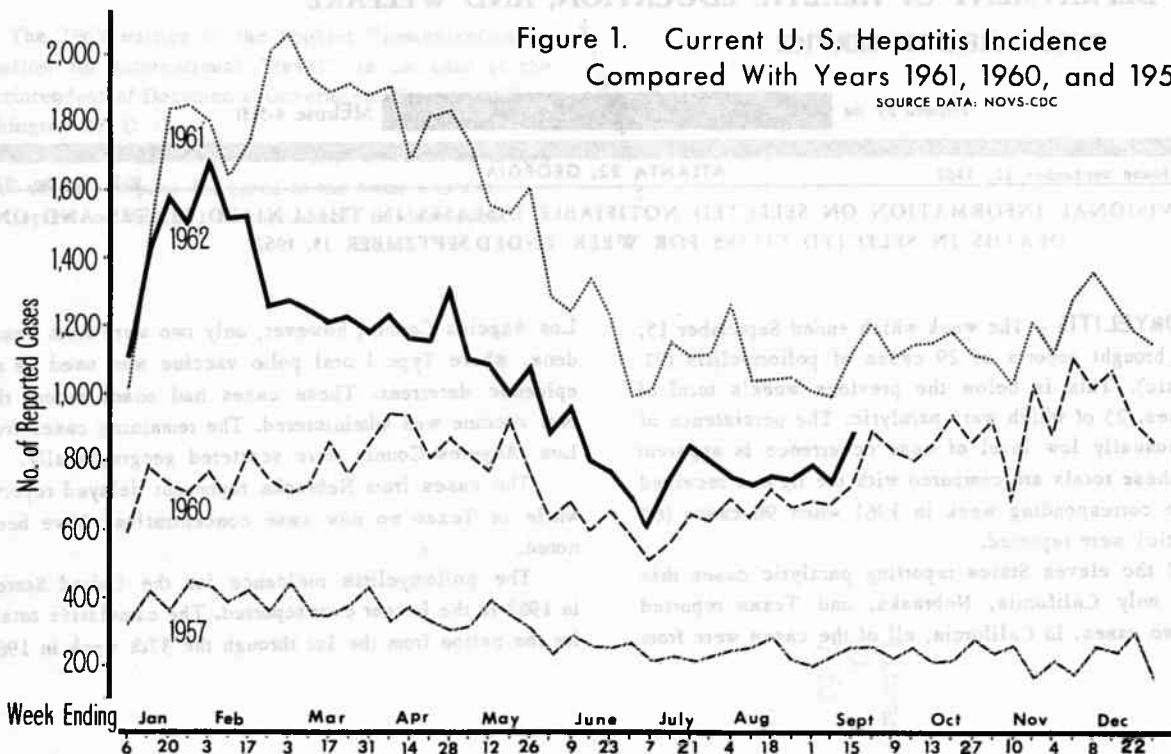


Figure 1. Current U. S. Hepatitis Incidence Compared With Years 1961, 1960, and 1957

HEPATITIS - There was a moderate increase in total reported cases for the week ending September 15, 1962, with 892 cases, as compared to 755 cases for the previous week. The increase is primarily in the Middle Atlantic (New York), East North Central (Michigan and Illinois) and South Atlantic Regions (Maryland and West Virginia).

The accompanying graph compares current U. S. hepatitis incidence with previous years.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL REPORTS

Arbovirus Encephalitis - Florida

From July 24 to September 17, 1962, a total of 244 cases of encephalitis-like illness have been investigated as possible cases of arbovirus encephalitis. Of these, 176 have been classified as laboratory confirmed, clinically

confirmed, or clinically possible, as shown in Table I.

Twelve patients classified as laboratory confirmed have had acute and convalescent sera showing an H.A.I. titer rise to Group B Arbovirus. The remainder of the cases considered "laboratory confirmed" have had a single sera, either acute or during convalescence, with an H.A.I. titer of 1 to 20 or greater. Nineteen deaths have been reported, as shown in Table II.

The Florida State Board of Health, with the assistance of the Communicable Disease Center of the USPHS, has established a regional laboratory for the study of arbovirus infections in the Tampa Bay area of Florida. Dr. James O. Bond is director of the combined epidemiological and laboratory field office.

Shigellosis Among Hospital Employees - New York State

Between July 18 and July 29, 1962, a total of 125 cases of gastroenteritis occurred in a hospital in New York State. Of the involved persons, 124 were hospital personnel, including 23 house physicians, 33 student nurses, and 13 dietary personnel. One case occurred in a hospitalized patient.

Two-thirds of the cases had onset during the first four days of the outbreak. Dates of onset for the cases are shown in the table below. The date of onset for the hospitalized patient is not known.

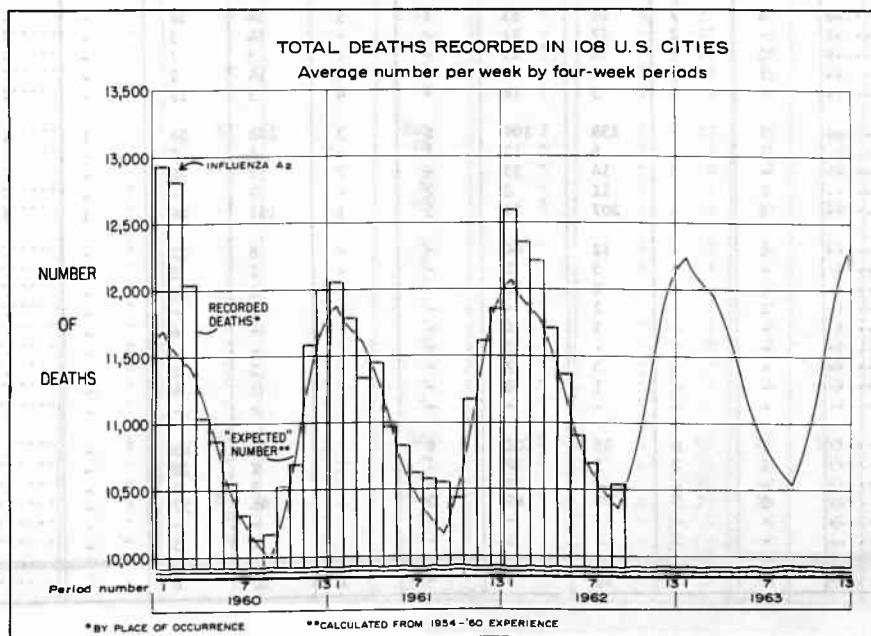
