PROVISIONAL INFORMATION ON SELECTED NOTIFIABLE DISEASES IN THE UNITED STATES AND ON DEATHS IN SELECTED CITIES FOR WEEK ENDED SEPTEMBER 29, 1962

POLIOMYELITIS - An increase in the number of reported cases of poliomyelitis was noted for the week which ended on September 29, 1962. A total of 43 cases (33 paralytic) were reported, which, though markedly increased over the number reported last week, is still below the totals for the comparable week in 1961 which accounted for 74 cases (37 paralytic).

Seventeen States reported cases with Alabama and Texas accounting for 5 cases each, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky and New York reporting 4. No new case concentrations have been noted. In Alabama, the reported cases occurred in the southern portion of the State, where an earlier type I outbreak was noted. The cases from Kentucky are from separate counties.

The cumulative totals of reported paralytic poliomyelitis in 1962 remain well below those for any previous year. The comparative figures for the past four years are shown in the following tabulation:

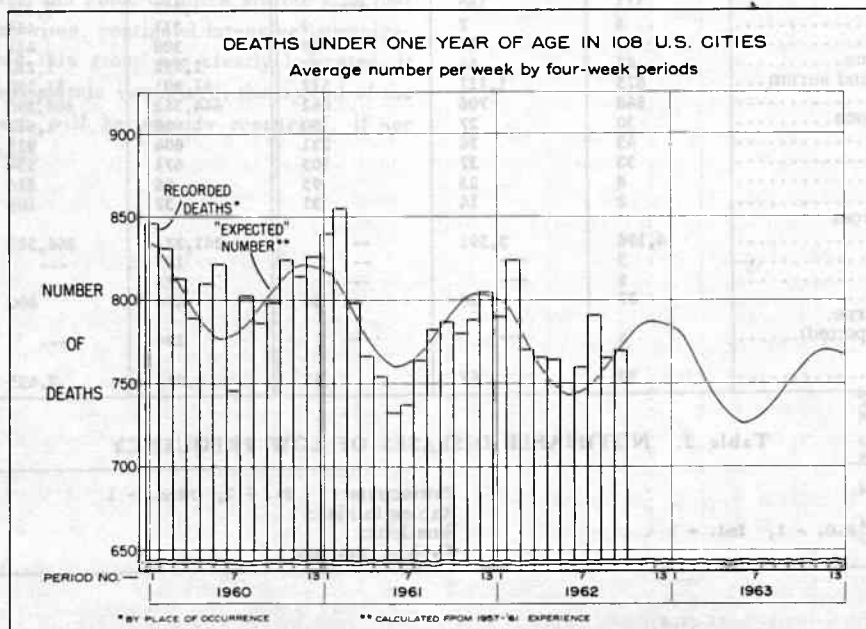
