The **Doing It** campaign is perfect for the general public or within your organization. It is a part of the Act Against AIDS initiative and delivers the message that HIV testing is a normal and routine part of life. The campaign features a diverse group of participants, community leaders, and celebrities. It also highlights people from many communities, including gay, bisexual, heterosexual, African American, Latino, white, youth, men, women, and transgender people. Available materials include the following:

- A general awareness palm card and over 40 poster layouts;
- Web banners (in three different sizes); and
- A public service announcement, a youth public service announcement, and over 40 video testimonials.



**HIV Screening.
Standard Care.™**

Serostatus Matters is a just-released training for primary care physicians, nurse practitioners, and registered nurses. This free training is online and includes a continuing education video that is part of the HIV Screening. Standard Care. campaign. It explains the importance of routine HIV screening and how to integrate routine HIV screening and counseling into clinical practices. The online training is hosted by the American Journal of Medicine, and it is jointly provided by Tufts University School of Medicine Office of Continuing Education, RTI International, and CDC.

The **HIV Risk Reduction Tool** explains the factors that increase or decrease HIV risk, and it helps users understand the choices that affect the likelihood of getting or transmitting HIV. This tool was developed for adults who are at least 18 years of age.



GetTested.cdc.gov is a nationwide database of HIV, STD, and Hepatitis testing sites. It also offers a questionnaire to help users understand which tests may be recommended for them under CDC guidelines.

HIV Testing Sites & Care Services Locator is a location-based search tool that allows you to search for testing services, housing providers, health centers and other service providers near your current location.
