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SPECIAL NOTE

The information provided in this report represents the latest data reported to the Poliomyelitis Surveillance Unit from State Health Departments, Epidemic Intelligence Service Officers, participating laboratories, and other pertinent sources. Much of the material is preliminary in nature and is subject to confirmation and change. It is distributed for the benefit of all participants with the understanding that it will not be released to the press or to unauthorized persons. Any release of this information will be strictly limited to the Office of the Surgeon General, United States Public Health Service, Washington, D.C. In such releases cases will be identified by state only; initials and residence will not be made public. State Health Officers, of course, are free to reveal any information they may wish concerning data from their State.

Dr. Joseph Melnick, Yale University, New Haven, reports the isolation of type 1 poliomyelitis virus from the stool of PSU case No. Conn-1. This Non-paralytic case developed a stiff neck and back, sore throat and fever 18 days following inoculation with Cutter Vaccine, and the spinal fluid Contained 55 cells. Dr. Melnick reports that the patient developed a positive complement fixation test prior to virus isolation. Ten cases, 7 paralytic, and 3 non-paralytic, were accepted today. Of these the two new Texas cases (both non-paralytic) and the Mississippi case received Lilly Vaccine. The other 7 received Cutter Vaccine.

A total of 62 cases have been accepted through 12:00 noon today (5-10-55). Type 1 polio virus has now been isolated from the stool in 6 of these cases. Suspects are now under investigation in California, Idaho, Ohio and Kansas. A breakdown of today's totals follows (Table 1).

Organization of diagnostic laboratory services in the Surveillance Program is progressing rapidly. Dr. Henry Kumm, Director of Research, NFIP, and Dr. Dorland J. Davis, Central Coordinator of the Sectional Research Program, NIH, have jointly notified PSU that the laboratories listed below have already expressed willingness to receive specimens for poliomyelitis reference diagnosis during the coming year. All of these laboratories participated in the Vaccine Evaluation Program during 1954. A small coordinating committee is expected to discuss and work out organization of the laboratory program in the near future. Meanwhile, State and local health officers should contact the most convenient laboratory when they have specimens to submit. If local arrangements cannot be made, specimens should be sent to the CDC Virus and Rickettsial Laboratory, Montgomery, Alabama.
