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PROVISIONAL INFORMATION ON SELECTED NOTIFIABLE DISEASES IN THE UNITED STATES AND ON DEATHS IN SELECTED CITIES FOR WEEK ENDED AUGUST 3, 1963

POLIOMYELITIS - The 8 cases of poliomyelitis, 7 paralytic, reported during the current week represents a remarkably low incidence of the disease, particularly for this season of the year. Less than half as many paralytic cases have been recorded this year as were reported during a comparable period in 1962.

Only four States, Pennsylvania, Alabama, Louisiana, California, have reported more than 10 paralytic cases thus far this year. Focal outbreaks in and near Carlisle, Pennsylvania, and Jasper, Alabama, have been countered with intensive Type I oral vaccine programs. Cases reported by Louisiana largely represent delayed reporting

from last year; California cases have been widely scattered.

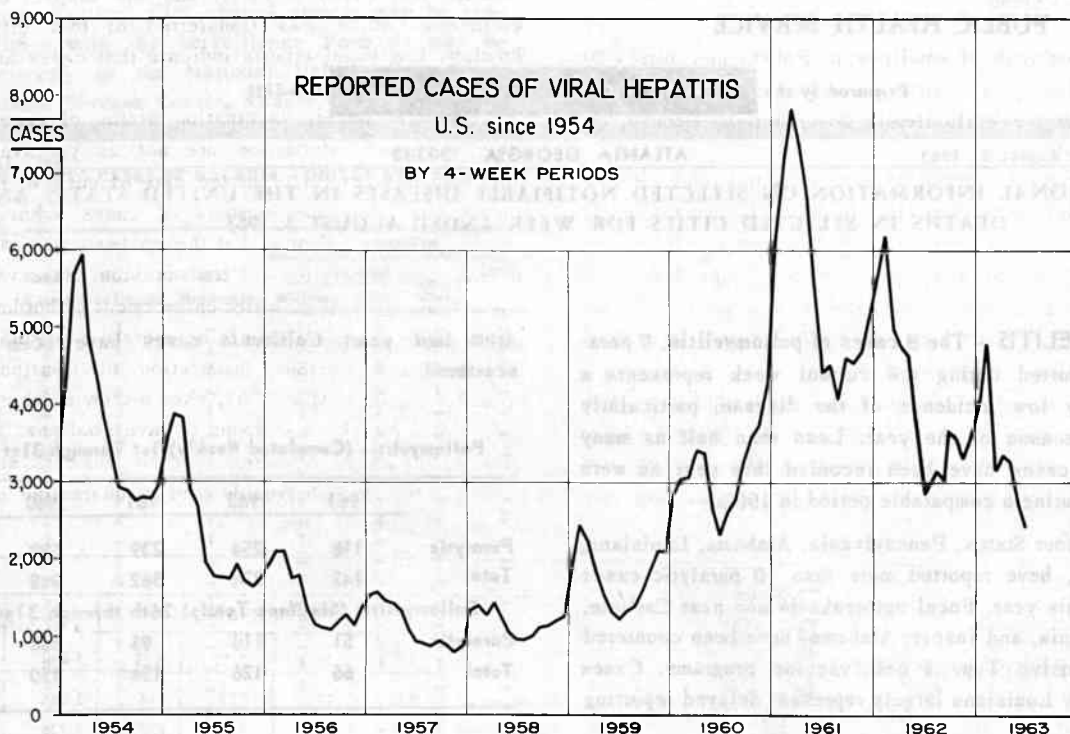

HEPATITIS - There were 677 cases of viral hepatitis reported during the week ending August 3, 1963. This compares to 737 cases recorded during a comparable period last year. The seasonal low for 1963 was reached during the week ending July 6, 1963. Based on previous years' experience a continuing upward trend through the rest of the year would be anticipated.

In the figure above, are shown the numbers of reported cases of viral hepatitis by 4-week periods since 1954.

Since hepatitis incidence customarily demonstrates a seasonal low in July, morbidity data can logically be summarized on the basis of an epidemiological year beginning in July and ending the following June. Attack rates for the epidemiological years 1959-60 through 1962-63 are given in the table (right).

While on a calendar year basis 1961 represents a sharp peak in the nationwide incidence, one observes from the table above that there were two epidemic waves of almost equal magnitude over the period of 2 epidemiological years, 1960-61 and 1961-62.

1962-63 represents a decreased incidence for the nation as a whole. During 1962-63, however, an extensive epidemic occurred in Maine which reported a rate of 202.5 cases per 100,000 population. The only State to exceed this rate since reporting was initiated was Alaska with a rate of 217.0 per 100,000 in 1961-62.

Rates higher than the previous 3 years were also experienced during 1962-63 in New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New York, and Louisiana. The only States which have consistently reported rates below 20.0 per 100,000 during the past 4 years are Wisconsin, Oklahoma, and Hawaii.

INTERNATIONAL NOTES - QUARANTINE MEASURES

Smallpox - Poland

The outbreak of smallpox in Poland now totals 79 cases including 6 deaths according to information received from the World Health Organization, Geneva, on August 6, 1963.

The original importation apparently involved a Polish man returning to Wroclaw (Breslau) from India on May 25. He was in good health on arrival, becoming ill shortly thereafter. Subsequently, six secondary cases developed among contacts before his illness was recognized as smallpox. The first recognized case occurred in a child with a previous history of chickenpox.

Up to July 29, 36 suspect cases, 10 confirmed, and six deaths were reported from Wroclaw. Several cases involved Health Department personnel who cared for the secondary cases before the diagnosis of smallpox was entertained.

In addition to the Wroclaw cases, official reports indicate four cases in Opole and one suspect case in Wieruszos, which was transferred to that city from Wroclaw. Unofficial reports indicate that cases are also occurring in Warsaw.

Dates of onset, vaccination status of cases, and other pertinent information are not as yet available. However, from appraisal of the date of entry of the imported case and the numbers of cases subsequently reported, it would appear that the epidemic has involved at least four generations of transmission. Mass vaccination efforts, as well as strict enforcement of border quarantine regulations, are said to be operative in Poland.

The last previous importation of smallpox into Poland occurred in May 1962, when a crew member of the S. S. Indian Resolve was found to have smallpox. Subsequently, 70 cases occurred in crew members and four cases among Polish guards and a quarantine official in contact with the crew.

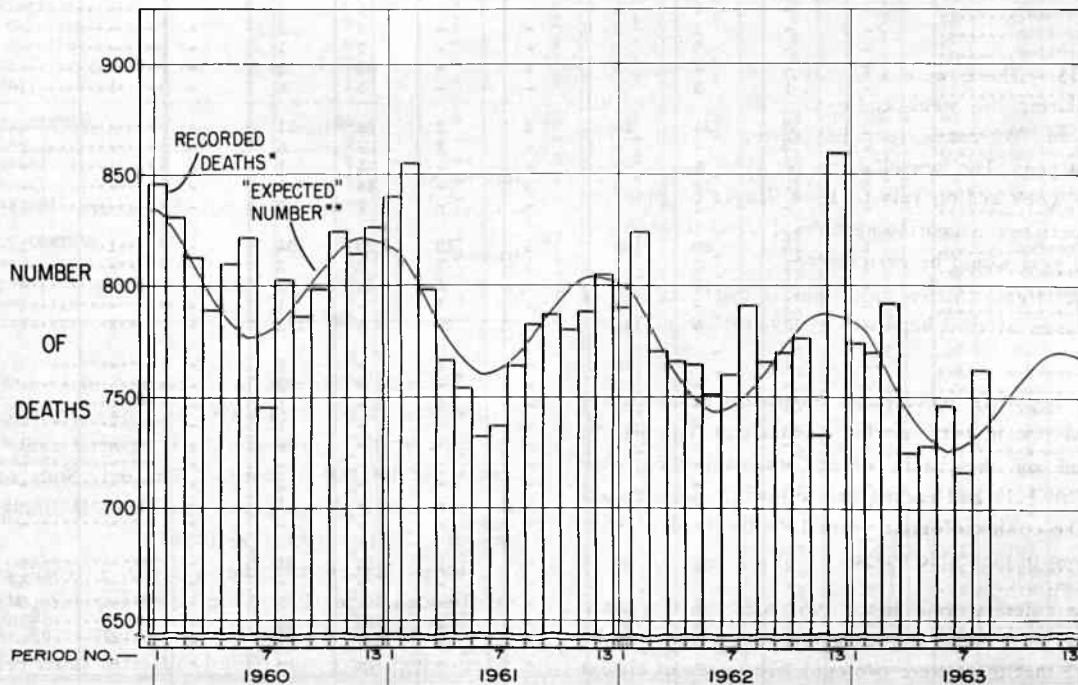
INFANT DEATHS IN 108 CITIES
