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SUMMARY OF PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

This issue of the Venereal Disease Statistical Letter presents data for the months of April-June 1955 and summarized data for the whole fiscal year. In the tables which follow you will find measures of both quantity and quality of venereal disease control activities. Some of the data are continuing tables of previous issues. Your attention is invited to the modifications in some of these and the addition of other new tables.

Page 12 carries the cases of venereal disease reported by State and Territorial health officers for the fiscal year. There is included a table showing the reported case rates per 100,000 population for each State and Territory by disease and stage. In order that the problem of early syphilis might more easily be visualized, a map, page 32, is also included which in varying degrees of shading combines the rates for the primary, secondary, and early latent stages.

Page 15 carries the rates of venereal disease for each of the large cities. While rates for States are based on Census Bureau estimates of civilian population in the State at the beginning of the fiscal year, the rates for cities are based on the Census population of April 1, 1950, inasmuch as available intercensal estimates are not made for cities.

The tables on pages 20 through 28 are measures of epidemiologic activities and efficiencies introduced in the Statistical Letter No. 45 for May 1955 which carries an explanation of their interpretation. State and Territorial health departments have now received their respective summaries of similar data for the 3 months April-June 1955 and for the full fiscal year which will permit a comparison with the region and the United States. In order to facilitate comparison, a summary table of PHS-2127 for Continental United States is presented on pages 20 and 21. These will permit comparisons for the full 2 years the new form has been in use.

The table on page 29 presents for the first time a summary of the number of blood specimens examined for syphilis as reported by State and Territorial laboratories on Form PHS-1072. These reports include specimens examined by laboratories reporting to State laboratories as well as specimens examined by the State laboratories themselves.

The data on first admissions to mental hospitals for psychoses due to syphilis are revised on pages 37 and 38 by the inclusion of 2 years, 1952 and 1953, the most recent years for which data are available. These data were last published in February 1954.

The activities involved in the examination of selectees and separatees suspected of having syphilis are shown in the tables on pages 31 through 36. We are happy to note the reduction in the number of "no disposition" in recent quarters.

The Statistical Letter is intended as a working tool in program management for those in the field of venereal disease control. We welcome suggestions as to how it can be refined and sharpened to increase its value.


