I. SUMMARY DETERMINATION

Section 20(a)(6) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, 29 U.S.C. 669(a)(6), authorizes the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare, following a written request by any employer or authorized representative of employees, to determine whether any substance normally found in the place of employment has potentially toxic effects in such concentrations as used or found.

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) received such a request from an authorized representative of employees to determine the potential of heat stress and exposure to smoke and fumes from improperly sealed boiler at the #3 Recovery Building at the Hoerner Waldorf Corporation of Montana.

A NIOSH industrial hygienist conducted an observational and an environmental survey of this facility on June 7 and 8, 1973. Based on information obtained at this time, <u>hazards did not exist</u> in the area evaluated, which was identified as #3 Recovery Building test station at the boiler exit.

During the environmental evaluation, samples were taken with a Drager hand pump and direct reading tubes. The following substances were checked for their presence at various intervals during a three-hour period: Nitrogen dioxide, sulphur dioxide, carbon monoxide, and hydrogen sulfide. All sample results were negative.

Established health standards for the above-mentioned compounds are listed below:
