

In Connecticut, <u>more than half</u> of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.

<u>One-quarter</u> of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.


<u>One in 4</u> dementia caregivers are in the "sandwich generation" – caring for both someone with dementia and a child or grandchild.


Percent of dementia caregivers providing help with specific tasks
