



DATA FROM THE 2016 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Montana, <u>more than half</u> of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.


One in 3 Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.

Among Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers, <u>nearly half</u> provide care to their parent or their parent-in-law. Percent of dementia caregivers providing care for at least 2 years


