
DATA FROM THE 2016 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In New Jersey, half of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.

Nearly 40 percent of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.


Among Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers, more than half provide care to their parent or their parent-in-law.
