
## DATA FROM THE 2015 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Florida, <u>more than one-third</u> of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.


<u>Nearly one-third</u> of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 20 or more hours of care per week.


The majority of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers – <u>more than 70 percent</u> – provide care to their parent or their parent-in-law.

Percent of dementia caregivers providing care for at least 2 years


