


DATA FROM THE 2015 BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM

In Utah, <u>nearly half</u> of all adults providing unpaid care to loved ones with Alzheimer's or another dementia have been doing so for at least two years.


<u>Nearly half</u> of Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers provide 9 or more hours of care per week.

Among Alzheimer's and dementia caregivers, more than one in every three provide care to their parent or their parent-inlaw. Percent of dementia caregivers providing care for at least 2 years
