2018 provisional data for the United States

- Chikungunya virus disease became a nationally notifiable condition in 2015. Cases are reported to CDC by state and local health departments using standard case definitions.
- As of June 12, 2018, a total of nine chikungunya virus disease cases with illness onset in 2018 have been reported to ArboNET from six U.S. states (Table & Map). All reported cases occurred in travelers returning from affected areas. No locallytransmitted cases have been reported from U.S. states.
- A total of zero chikungunya virus disease cases with illness onset in 2018 have been reported to ArboNET from U.S. territories (Table).

States reporting chikungunya virus disease cases – United States, 2018 (as of June 12, 2018)


