PROVISIONAL INFORMATION ON SELECTED NOTIFIABLE DISEASES IN THE UNITED STATES AND ON DEATHS IN SELECTED CITIES FOR WEEK ENDED JULY 25, 1964

TYPHOID FEVER

A total of 16 cases of typhoid fever was reported for the week ended July 25. This brings to 234 the cumulative total for 1964. For the comparable period of 1963, 237 cases were reported. The accompanying table lists the cases reported through the 30th week and the annual totals for the past 5 years.

The 5 East North Central States have reported 60 cases (26 percent of the national cumulative total). Ohio's total of 26 cases is the highest for any one State. Thus far, cases have been reported from all but 13 States and the District of Columbia.

By and large, during recent years, reports of typhoid cases in the United States have represented isolated cases or small family outbreaks.

No case of typhoid fever reported in the United States thus far has been associated with the recent epidemic in Aberdeen, Scotland (see MMWR, Vol. 13, p. 185). Phage type 34, very rarely reported, was identified in that outbreak.

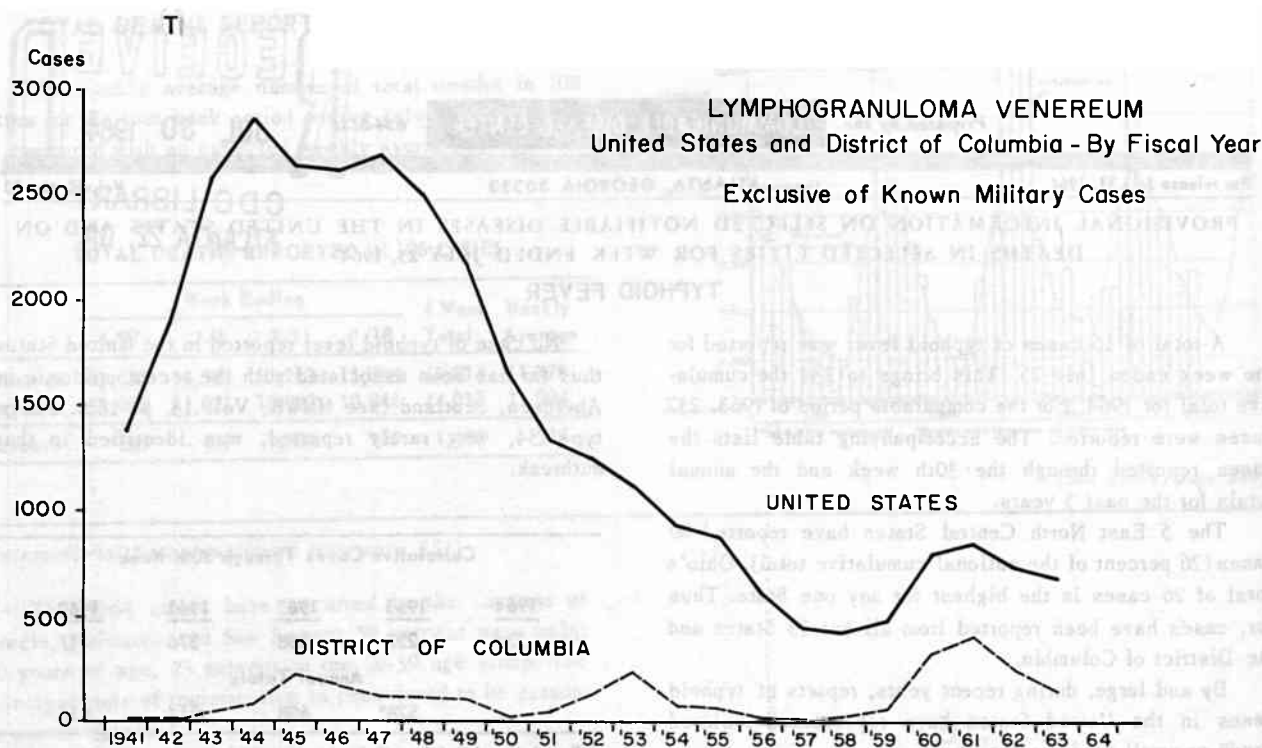

CHEMICAL FOOD POISONING - California

A total of 25 individuals experienced sudden nausea, vomiting and abdominal cramps from 10-40 minutes after consuming an orange beverage at a Square Dance party of 100 persons in San Diego. Some victims also experienced dizziness and fainted. The average duration of symptoms was 2 hours. A number of guests detected an abnormal taste on first sipping and therefore drank no more of the beverage; they did not become ill. One victim was hospitalized; she had consumed more orange drink than her friends. There were no deaths.

Orange fountain syrup had been mixed with water and ice in a 15-year-old 10-gallon copper-lined thermos container which had been plated with cadmium. The pH of the drink was 2.6.

Both copper and cadmium were recovered from the orange drink on laboratory analysis. Cadmium was present to the extent of 115 ppm mg/L and copper 42 ppm.

Editor's Note: Because of the tendency of cadmium to dissolve in contact with acid foods, sales of cadmium plated containers are banned in many states to prevent such chemical poisonings.

LYMPHOGRANULOMA VENEREUM

A total of 589 cases of lymphogranuloma venereum was reported for the fiscal year 1963. This total excludes known military cases. The 589 cases compare with 635 cases reported for the fiscal year 1962. Of the 589 cases, 138 (23 percent) were reported from the District of Columbia.

The number of reported cases has declined steadily from a peak of 2,858 cases in fiscal 1944 to a low of 436 in fiscal 1958. (See graph above.)

The rise in cases since fiscal 1959 is due primarily to increased reports from the District of Columbia. Beginning in 1960, one clinic has instituted the routine use of the Frei and complement fixation tests in the differential diagnosis of patients with perirectal abscesses and/or fistulae in ano.¹ The routine use of this screening test in this one clinic has accounted for the District of Columbia's rise.

SUMMARY OF REPORTED CASES OF INFECTIOUS SYPHILIS — JUNE 1964 - JUNE 1963

A total of 1,988 cases of infectious syphilis was reported for June. This figure represents a 13 percent increase over the 1,763 cases reported for June 1963. The 1964 cumulative total is 11,318 cases which represents a 4 percent increase over the same period of 1963, when 10,841 cases were reported.

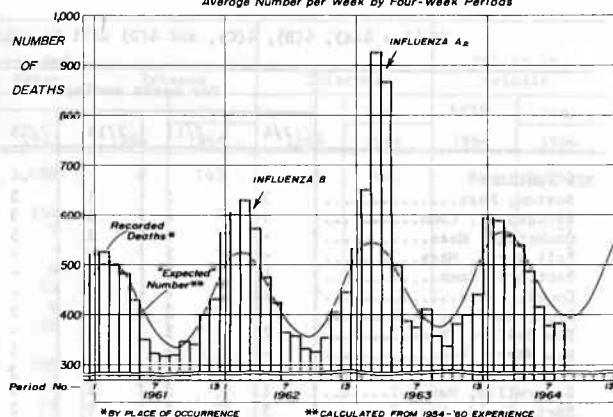
