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PROVISIONAL INFORMATION ON SELECTED NOTIFIABLE DISEASES IN THE UNITED STATES AND ON
DEATHS IN SELECTED CITIES FOR WEEK ENDED SEPTEMBER 12, 1964

ENCEPHALITIS

A total of 115 cases of primary encephalitis was reported for the week ended September 12. This brings to 2,139 the cumulative total recorded during 1964.

Of the cases reported during the past week, 53 were from Texas. The Houston epidemic has been waning since the peak incidence during the week ended August 29. An epidemiological report concerning the Houston outbreak is included in this issue.

Twenty cases were reported from Kansas. These cases are scattered in many counties and have been

occurring over the past month. No laboratory confirmation is available yet.

An outbreak of 30 suspect cases of St. Louis Encephalitis is under investigation in Danville, Kentucky. (See MMWR, Vol. 13, p. 315). Most of the cases have occurred during the past 4 weeks in the urban area.

Twenty-five suspect cases of encephalitis are also being studied in Colorado. There is serological evidence of both Western Encephalitis and St. Louis Encephalitis among these cases.

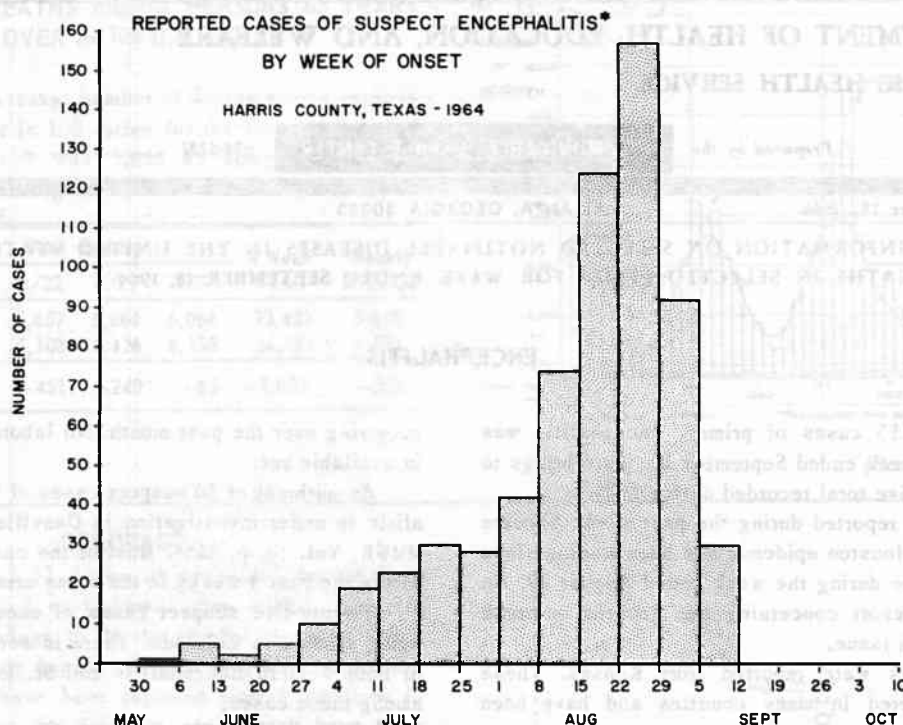

ENCEPHALITIS - TEXAS

Harris County

Through September 12, a total of 668 suspected cases of St. Louis Encephalitis, including 31 deaths, has been reported from Harris County (Houston), Texas. (See previous reports, MMWR, Vol. 13, pp. 290, 302, and 312).

A revised epidemic curve for the 642 cases with known date of onset is shown above. Since the peak incidence during the week ended August 29, there has been a progressive fall-off in the number of cases reported.

The overall attack rate is 53.7 per 100,000. The highest attack rate has occurred in the age group 70 years

and older (159.3 per 100,000).

With the exception of 2 deaths in the 30-39 year age group, all of the deaths have occurred in those over 50 years of age. A tabulation of total cases by age, deaths and cases per 100,000 are presented in the table below. (Reported by Charles A. Pigford, M.D., Director of Public Health, Houston, Van C. Tipton, M.D., Director, Communicable Disease Division, Texas State Department of Health, and a team from the Communicable Disease Center.)

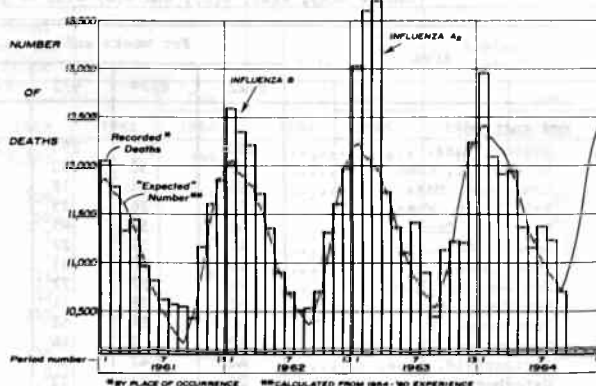

Travelers leaving Kenya are required to possess a certificate for entry to Burma, Cape Verde Islands, Ceylon, Greece, India, Iraq, Lebanon, Libya, Madeira and Azores, Malaysia (except Sabah and Sarawak), Malta, Muscat and Oman, Mozambique, Nauru Island, Pakistan, Papua-New Guinea, Portuguese Guinea, Portuguese Timor, Sao Tome and Principe, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, South West Africa, United Arab Republic." All other information remains the same.
