CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION (CDC) EXTRAMURAL RESEARCH AND EDUCATION PROGRAM ON LYME DISEASE

The Division of Vector-Borne Infectious Diseases has published two announcements in the Federal Register to fund research and education on Lyme disease. Through Announcement 800, Cooperative Agreements to Conduct Research on the Diagnosis and Pathogenesis of Lyme Disease in the US, approximately \$1 million will be awarded. Applications for Announcement 800 are due on or before July 28, 1997. Through Announcement 801, Cooperative Agreements to Conduct Research and Education Programs on Lyme Disease in the US, approximately \$1.7 million will be awarded. Applications for Announcement 801 are due on or before August 1, 1997. Awards for both announcements will be made in February 1998.

In order to assist CDC in planning for and executing the evaluation of these applications, all parties intending to submit applications are requested to send a notice of intent to apply no later than June 13, 1997.
