Investigational 9-valent HPV vaccine

- □ L1 VLP vaccine, similar to quadrivalent HPV vaccine
- Targets 5 additional high risk types
 - 6,11,16,18, 31, 33, 45, 52, 58
- BLA submitted to FDA in December 2013
 - Females 9-26 yrs, males 9-15 yrs
 - Trials conducted with 3-dose schedule
- Males 16-26 yrs not part BLA submitted in 2013
 - Presentation for ACIP today
- ACIP WG reviewing data and considering policy options for presentation to ACIP
