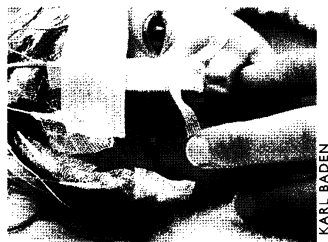

## IMPORTANT SUBSCRIBER INFORMATION

To keep our subscription prices down, the Government Printing Office mails each subscriber only one renewal notice. You can learn when you will get your renewal notice by checking the number that follows ISSDUE on the top line of your label. For example:

HSMHASMITH212J	ISSDUE0 0 2 R 1
JOHN SMITH	
212 MAIN ST	
FORESTVILLE MD 20747	

Above, the ISSDUE is 2, meaning that you will receive two more issues before your subscription lapses.

When that number reads ISSDUE000, you have received your last issue unless you renew. You should receive your renewal notice around the time that you receive the issue with ISSDUE000.

To be sure that your service continues without interruption, please return your renewal notice promptly. If your subscription service is discontinued, simply send your mailing label from any issue to the Superintendent of Documents, Washington DC 20202, with the proper remittance and your service will be reinstated.
