

The Voices of Children: A Violence Prevention Project

The Voices of Children: Messages of Hope and Optimism for a Kinder World, a book and traveling photo exhibit, uses original artwork and writings to convey children's thoughts, feelings, hopes, and fears about peace and violence. Sponsored by Deaconess-Nashoba Hospital in Ayer, Massachusetts, and its Trustee Community Relations Committee, this project is part of the hospital's continuing initiative against violence, which began with a forum on domestic violence in 1994.

The young artists and authors, fifth graders from eight towns in the semi-rural area served by the hospital, share how they cope with issues such as bullying, media violence, family discord, drugs, gangs, and war. The project's message is that "children deserve to be surrounded by caring adults who respect them, listen to them, and help them grow."

The Massachusetts Attorney General's Community Advisory Task Force selected the Voices of Children project as one of six examples of a best practice by a Massachusetts hospital or health maintenance organization.
