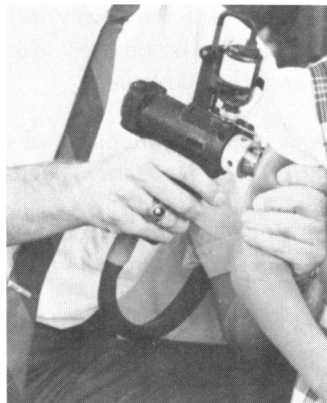

## ENT for the primary care practitioner.

An educational program designed for the primary care physician will focus on the most useful and advanced methods of treatment for clinical problems of the ear, nose, and throat. The program will be conducted February 12-19, 1983, in Park City, Utah. A "topic of the day" format will be used to provide in-depth coverage of basic (traditional) ENT (ear, nose, and throat) treatment, trauma and stabilization, common tumors and neurological problems, and the ear

from A to Z. Pediatric aspects of ENT treatment will also be included, and new directions in treatment will be presented, as well as an overview of plastic surgery techniques, a discussion of facial aesthetic surgery, and a pigs feet suture practicum.

Extended Programs in Medical Education of the University of California School of Medicine at San Francisco is presenting the program in cooperation with the school's Department of Otolaryngology and Division of Family

Medicine. The symposium will meet the criteria for 20 hours of ACCME/American Medical Association/CMA, of AAFP, and of ACEP category 1 (formal) continuing education credit.

## Training Courses of the Centers for Disease Control

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) provide leadership and direction to programs designed to improve the health of the people of the United States by preventing or controlling diseases, improving laboratory performance, assuring safe and healthful working conditions, and responding to health emergencies.

The training services of CDC exist primarily to satisfy the needs of State and local health departments. After this obligation has been fulfilled, services are made available to other Federal agencies, international agencies, private industry and universities, other agencies and organizations, and private individuals.

**Application procedures.** Applications for courses can be obtained from specific Centers and Program Offices. Applications may also be available from State health departments, and from the Director, Division of Preventive Health Services, in the HHS (Health and Human Services) Regional Offices.

**Course credit.** The Centers for Disease Control is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education to sponsor continuing medical education (CMEs) for physicians. CMEs for Category I are awarded on the basis of 1 hour of credit per hour of instruction. CDC is also a member of the Council on the Continuing Education Unit and awards continuing education units (CEUs) for satisfactory completion of courses. CEUs are awarded on the basis of 1 CEU per 10 hours of instruction. Several professional associations in the laboratory sciences have independently accredited CDC laboratory courses for CEUs.

**Courses available.** The table shows the CDC training courses (a) for which application must be made before specified dates in the period November 1, 1982-June 30, 1983, or (b) when there is no closing date, those for which the course dates fall within this period. Each course is listed under its CDC sponsor. All courses are held in Atlanta, Ga., unless otherwise noted.

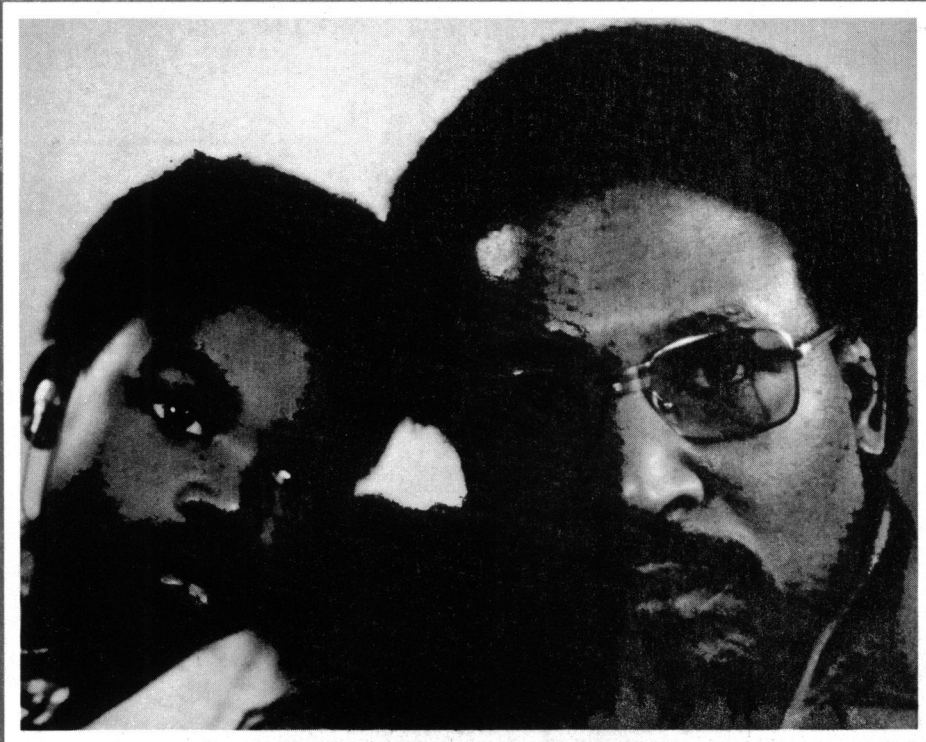
