International Cancer Research Grants. Applications may now be filed for two programs administered by the International Union Against Cancer (UICC): the International Cancer Research Technology Transfer Project and the Yamagiwa-Yoshida Memorial International Cancer Study Grants.

The purpose of the International Cancer Research Technology Transfer Project is to promote direct and rapid transfer of information or methods between investigators in different countries who are working in basic, clinical, or behavioral research relevant to cancer. The period of study abroad must not exceed 28 days.

Funds are provided by the International Cancer Research Data Bank of the National Cancer Institute and by the UICC and its member organizations. Grants are allocated toward travel and living expenses. The program is not open to employees of U.S. government agencies. There are no application deadlines.

The Yamagiwa-Yoshida Memorial International Cancer Study Grants are designed to enable investigators of any nationality to gain experience in or make comparative studies of special techniques in both the biological and clinical aspects of cancer research in another country. Normally the grants are awarded for 2–6 weeks, but under no circumstances do they exceed 90 days. Application deadlines are June 30 and December 31 each year. Successful applicants will be notified within 90 days of the closing date.
