### UNITED STATES.

Yellow fever in the South.

[Continuing the report of yellow fever in the South from October 21.]

October 22: Dr. G. B. Thornton, president of the board of health at Memphis, Tenn., makes official report of the presence of yellow fever at that place. Acting Assistant Surgeon John Guitéras wires from Montgomery that he confirms the diagnosis of the local physicians, and reports that he has seen 15 cases of yellow fever in Montgomery. Upon request of Dr. John A. McKinnon, president board of health, Dr. Guitéras was ordered to Selma, Ala., to investigate suspicious cases there.

October 23: Acting Assistant Surgeon Guitéras reports that he has seen 7 cases of yellow fever in Selma, Ala. Passed Assistant Surgeon Young was authorized to take charge of the disinfection of all mail from Memphis.

October 24: President Seelye, of the Montgomery, Ala., board of health, and Dr. Glen Andrews, city physician, request the Surgeon-General, Marine-Hospital Service, to send a force and take charge of disinfection, etc. In response to this request, Surgeon Carter was ordered from New Orleans to Montgomery to confer with the authorities, make recommendations, and take immediate action if necessary.

October 25: The Tennessee board of health having forbidden refugees from Memphis stopping in West Tennessee, and requested the enforcement of said order by the Marine-Hospital Service, Passed Assistant Surgeon Young, in charge of train inspection service in that district, was directed to enforce the order.

October 26: Surgeon Carter, having reported upon the necessities of

the situation at Montgomery, was authorized to employ necessary help and take charge of the disinfection, etc.

October 27: Passed Assistant Magruder reports yellow fever present in Galveston, Tex.; number of cases not stated. A telegram from Dr. John A. McKinnon, president of the Selma, Ala., board of health, states that there have been no new cases of yellow fever and no deaths in Selma for three days past, and that light frosts have occurred. Dr. McKinnon requests the Service to take charge of disinfection at Selma. Apparatus was shipped at once by express.

October 28: Passed Assistant Surgeon Young authorized, upon request from Memphis authorities and railroads interested, to assume charge of the disinfection of freight from Memphis.

### Sanitary reports from Rio.

RIO DE JANEIRO, September 20, 1897.

SIR: I have the honor to transmit the report for the week ended September 18, 1897:

There were 6 deaths from accesso pernicioso, an increase of 3; none from yellow fever, 1 in the foregoing week; 1 from smallpox, none in the foregoing week; 1 from beriberi, a decrease of 3; 1 each from enteric fever and measles, none in the foregoing week; none from whooping cough, 1 in the foregoing week; 37 from tuberculosis, an increase of 4, and 246 from all causes, an increase of 33.

The health of the town and port is excellent; no infectious cases amongst the shipping. The most prevalent diseases are those of the respiratory system, which always prevail during the winter months.

Bahia.—Telegrams continue to be published here from Bahia, relating the continuance of smallpox in that State, especially in the army in operations. Nothing very trustworthy is known here.

The health of this town and port continues excellent, but fevers of a bad character and variola are reported in Amazonas. On the 25th of this month there were 477 cases of variola under treatment in Bahia,

principally soldiers.

### CUBA.

Smallpox and yellow fever in Cuban seaports.

October 19: The United States consul at Cardenas reports that during the week ended October 16 there were in that city no deaths from yellow fever and no deaths from smallpox.

October 18: The United States consul at Cienfuegos reports that during the week ended October 17 there were in that city 2 deaths from yellow fever and no deaths from smallpox.

October 22: The United States consul at Matanzas reports that during the two weeks ended October 20 there were in that city 6 deaths from yellow fever.

October 23: The United States sanitary inspector at Habana reports that during the week ended October 21 there were in that city 13 deaths from yellow fever and 2 deaths from smallpox.

October 18: The United States consul at Sagua la Grande reports that during the week ended October 16 there were in that city 36 cases and 2 deaths from yellow fever and 35 cases and 3 deaths from smallpox.

### Sanitary report from Habana.

HABANA, CUBA, October 23, 1897.

SIR: I have the honor to inform you that there were 471 deaths in this city during the week ended October 21. Thirteen of those deaths were caused by yellow fever, 29 by enteric fever, 13 by malarial fever, 90 by enteritis, 29 by dysentery, 60 by tuberculosis, 4 by pneumonia, 6 by starvation, 1 by the grip, and 1 by the measles. Twelve of the 13 deaths by yellow fever were among Spanish soldiers in the military hospitals, while the remaining one was a civilian in the city. Although no deaths from smallpox are reported during the week, it is believed that 2 have occurred.

It will be noticed that intestinal diseases, as enteritis and dysentery, continue to an alarming degree, and that 119, or more than one-fourth of all the deaths, were from those diseases alone. In certain localities and under unusually bad hygienic conditions, some of those cases have taken on choleraic symptoms, as occasionally occurs in the cities of this island, particularly when fruit or bad food is consumed during changeable and rainy weather. During the last six weeks or more a great deal of rain has fallen, but just now the weather is beautiful, though rather warm.

### JAPAN.

### Sanitary report from Yokohama.

YOKOHAMA, October 1, 1897.

SIR: I have the honor to forward, herewith, my regular report of infectious disease in Japan, for period September 23 to September 30, 1897.

Owing to the imperfections of the returns, as at present furnished, it is difficult, or impossible, accurately to estimate the comparative prevalence of the existing epidemic. Taking the report as it stands, however, it is evident that, despite a decided reduction of the average temperature during the twenty days just past, any marked improvement in the sanitary condition of the country, though claimed by the Japanese as manifest, is, at least, doubtful.

As regards the important ports of Kobe and Yokohama, I am glad to be able to state, from independent knowledge, that but a very few cases of dysentery have occurred during the period in question.

### Yellow fever in San Salvador.

SAN SALVADOR, October 7, 1897.

The epidemic of yellow fever first started here in the capital in the month of May, 1894. The first person attacked was one of the mail-service boys, who caught it at La Libertad, the port on the Pacific. Ever since we have had the epidemic, but it increases during the months of June, July, August, September, October, and even November; that is, during the rainy season in this country. The cases observed during the months of December, January, February, March, April, and May have been very few and of a very mild character, and generally marked by either influenza or malaria.

We have also noted that the epidemic decreases yearly, both in number and intensity, this applying to both foreigners and natives. This is the general rule of epidemics, and is due to the acclimation of the inhabitants.

is due to the acclimation of the inhabitants.

In studying yellow fever of Habana, Rio de Janeiro, and New Orleans, and comparing it to ours, we only find differences in the intensity of the symptoms.

Most all our cases that died were on the sixth, seventh, and eighth days, and the causes

generally were collapse, intestinal hemorrhage, and uraemia. The mortality during the year of 1894 was 60 per cent; 1895, 40 per cent, and 1896, 38 per cent.

The report for the year 1897 has not been completed. The cases reported now are as

follows: July, 38 cases, 11 deaths; August, 54 cases, 16 deaths; September, 34 cases,

12 deaths.

The highest rate was recorded in Bolton, viz, 26.2, and the lowest in Portsmouth, viz, 9.4.

London.—One thousand three hundred and twenty-four deaths were registered during the week, including measles, 19; scarlet fever, 20; diphtheria, 53; whooping cough, 21; enteric fever, 24; and diarrhea and dysentery, 32. The deaths from all causes correspond to an annual rate of 15.5 a thousand. In greater London 1,726 deaths were registered, corresponding to an annual rate of 14.3 a thousand of the population. In the "outer ring" the deaths included 13 from diphtheria, 5 from measles, 1 from scarlet fever, and 8 from whooping cough.

Ireland.—The average annual death rate represented by the deaths registered during the week ended October 9 in the 23 principal town districts of Ireland was 20.5 a thousand of the population. The lowest rate was recorded in Portadown, viz, 0.0, and the highest in Sligo, viz, 45.7 a thousand. In Dublin and suburbs 147 deaths were registered, including scarlet fever, 3, and enteric fever, 4.

Scotland.—The deaths registered in 8 principal towns during the week ended October 9 correspond to an annual rate of 19.8 a thousand of the population, which is estimated at 1,549,907. The lowest mortality was recorded in Perth, viz, 8.5, and the highest in Dundee, viz, 24.2 a thousand. The aggregate number of deaths registered from all causes was 590, including measles, 3; scarlet fever, 13; diphtheria, 5, and whooping cough, 12.

West Indies—Guadeloupe.—Two weeks ended September 15, 1897. Estimated population, 18,500. Total deaths, 18. No deaths from contagious diseases.
