Reports from San Francisco, Cal.—Status of plague—Plague-prevention work, San Francisco and Oakland.

Passed Assistant Surgeon Blue reports:

November 20. One new case of plague to-day, a Japanese; diagnosis confirmed by bacteriological examination. Record to date: 97 cases; 60 deaths.

November 21. One new case of plague to-day, a German; occupation, baker; City and County Hospital; diagnosis confirmed by bacteriological examination. Record to date: Cases, 98; deaths, 60.

November 22. A case of plague which died November 19 was confirmed by bacteriological examination to-day. Another case died to-day. Record to date: Cases, 99; deaths, 62.

November 23. Two cases of plague, bacteriologically examined, confirmed to-day, one a Californian, one a Chinaman. The Californian died November 20, but diagnosis was confirmed November 23. Record to date: Cases, 101; deaths, 63.

November 26. Two new cases of plague to-day, both Californians; diagnosis in both cases confirmed by bacteriological examination. One death. Record to date: Cases, 103; deaths, 64.

STATISTICAL REPORTS OF MORBIDITY AND MORTALITY, STATES AND CITIES OF THE UNITED STATES—UNTABULATED.

CALIFORNIA—*Oakland*.—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 225,000. Total number of deaths 156, including measles 1, enteric fever 5, plague 2, and 14 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 17, enteric fever 2, plague 2, scarlet fever 1, smallpox 20, measles 1, whooping cough 1, and tuberculosis 4.

San Diego.—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 40,000. Total number of deaths, 53, including diphtheria 1, enteric fever 1, and 8 from tuberculosis. Cases: Enteric fever 6, diphtheria 4, and scarlet fever 1.

COLORADO—*Colorado Springs*.—Month of September, 1907. Estimated population, 32,000. Total number of deaths, 40, including diphtheria 1, enteric fever 1, and 15 from tuberculosis. Cases: Enteric fever 6 and diphtheria 1. Month of October, 1907. Total number of deaths, 39, including enteric fever 3 and 14 from tuberculosis. Cases: Scarlet fever 5 and enteric fever 31.

CONNECTICUT—*Bridgeport*.—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 95,000. Total number of deaths, 129, including diphtheria 2, enteric fever 5, scarlet fever 1, and 15 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 14, enteric fever 14, measles 5, scarlet fever 4, whooping cough 4, and phthisis pulmonalis 4.

FLORIDA.—Reports to the State board of health for the week ended November 16, 1907, show as follows: Diphtheria—*Jacksonville*, *Tampa*, and *St. Augustine*, each 2 cases; *Oakland*, 1 case. Enteric fever—*Jacksonville*, 3 cases; *Tampa*, 1 case. Smallpox—*Mandarin*, 1 case. Tuberculosis—*Jacksonville*, 3 cases.

ILLINOIS—*Rockford*.—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 45,000. Total number of deaths, 44; including diphtheria 2 and 6 from phthisis pulmonalis. Cases: Diphtheria 7, scarlet fever 1, and smallpox 1.

IOWA—*Davenport*.—Two weeks ended November 16, 1907. Estimated population, 45,000. Total number of deaths not reported. One death from enteric fever and 1 from scarlet fever. Cases: Diphtheria 24, enteric fever 12, measles 1, scarlet fever 1, and whooping cough 1.

MINNESOTA—*Minneapolis*.—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 285,000. Total number of deaths, 219, including diphtheria 3, enteric fever 9, scarlet fever 1, whooping cough 2, and 27 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 45, enteric fever 20, scarlet fever 25, smallpox 12, and tuberculosis 21.

NEBRASKA—*Lincoln*.—Month of August, 1907. Estimated population, 55,000. Total number of deaths, 57, including enteric fever 4, and 3 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 4, scarlet fever 2, and smallpox, 3.

Month of September, 1907. Total number of deaths, 43, including diphtheria 1, enteric fever 4, whooping cough 7, and 7 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 7, and scarlet fever 1.

Month of October, 1907. Total number of deaths, 51, including diphtheria 2, enteric fever 1, and 1 from phthisis pulmonalis. Cases: Diphtheria 12, scarlet fever 1, and smallpox 1.

NEW YORK.—*Buffalo*.—Month of September,^a 1907. Estimated population, 400,000. Total number of deaths, 558, including diphtheria 2, enteric fever 17, measles 3, scarlet fever 3, smallpox 1, whooping cough 4, and 28 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 45, enteric fever 58, measles 18, scarlet fever 61, smallpox 1, whooping cough 29, and tuberculosis 41.

Troy.—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 76,861. Total number of deaths, 129, including diphtheria 6, enteric fever 2,

and 14 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 28, enteric fever 10, measles 31, scarlet fever 2, whooping cough 4, and tuberculosis 27.

NORTH CAROLINA.—Month of September, 1907. Estimated population, 1,893,810. Reports to State board of health from 82 counties show as follows: Measles in 13 counties, whooping cough in 20 counties, scarlet fever in 22 counties, diphtheria in 42 counties, enteric fever in 68 counties, malarial fever in 24 counties, pernicious malarial fever in 4 counties, hemorrhagic malarial fever in 3 counties, and smallpox in 9 counties, viz: Alamance, 2; Cabarrus, 5; Camden, 1; Chatham, 8; Guilford, 1; Mitchell, —; Orange, 1; Warren, 6, and Watauga, 10.

Reports for the month from 24 towns having an aggregate population of 231,900—white, 140,850; colored, 91,050—show a total of 305 deaths—white, 150; colored, 155—including diphtheria 1, enteric fever 28, malarial fever 10, whooping cough 1, and 36 from phthisis pulmonalis.

OHIO—*East Liverpool.*—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 20,000. Total number of deaths, 21, including diphtheria 1, and 1 from enteric fever. Cases: Enteric fever 1, scarlet fever 3, and diphtheria 3.

FOREIGN AND INSULAR.

CURRENT QUARANTINE MEASURES.

[From the Veröffentlichungen des Kaiserlichen Gesundheitsamtes, Berlin, November 6, 1907.]

CHOLERA.

AUSTRIA.—October 25. On account of outbreak of cholera at Lublin the governor of Lemberg has directed that travelers arriving from Russia be subject at the frontier stations of Uhrynów and Belzec to medical inspection of person and baggage. The local authorities at Lemberg have ordered into effect thorough measures of street cleaning and supervision of food and water supply. Handlers of old clothing and rags and the public generally are informed of the relation of these articles to the spread of disease. Supervision is ordered of all public kitchens and tea houses for the poor. Inoculation against cholera is being considered. The government of Bukowina has established a medical inspection service on the Bukowina-Russian Railroad for persons arriving from Russia.

BULGARIA.—October 17. Workmen returning from Russia will be admitted only at the ports of Varna on the Black Sea and Silesiria on the Danube and shall at those points be subject to medical inspection of person and effects. The importation of raw food products from Russia is prohibited.

ROUMANIA.—October 25. Quarantine measures in force against certain places in Russia extended to include arrivals from Kischinew. October 26. Only the frontier stations of Ungheni and Gura Prutuli remain open.

CHINA.—September 13. The German consul at Mukden directed the same quarantine measures as were applied to arrivals from Amboy and Foochow to be applied to arrivals from Moji.

RUSSIA.—October 25 and 30. Districts of Kief and Tschenkaffy in the government of Kief, and the governments of Cherson, Bessarabia, Kursk, and Orenburg, and the Turgai territory declared cholera threatened.

SWITZERLAND.—October 26. Measures for protection against cholera and plague put in force, and the following localities in Russia declared infected: The governments of Saratov, Samara, Astrakhan, Nizhni Novgorod, Kasan, Simbirsk, Kostroma, Jaroslov, Penza, Vitka, Vladmir, and Ekaterinoslay, and the cities of Baku, Rostrov on Don, and Kief, and the Don territory.

PLAGUE.

EGYPT.—October 22. Plague regulations applied at Egyptian ports against arrivals from Mitylene. October 26. Suspended.

ITALY. October 29. Quarantine against arrivals from Oran suspended.

NETHERLANDS.—October 26. Bombay and Calcutta declared plague infected and importation of rags and used body and bed clothing forbidden. Travelers' baggage falls under these restrictions as regards the last-named articles. This prohibition does not apply to articles which have not originated at Bombay or Calcutta or which have been so packed as not to come in contact with infected material.

AFRICA.

Report from Cape Colony—Examination of rodents at King Williams Town for plague infection.

The following is received from the medical officer of health for the colony under date of October 21:

Week ended October 19:

King Williams Town.

No case of plague was discovered during the week. Forty-three rats (including 15 found dead) and 93 mice (including 9 found dead) were examined, of which 15 rats and 8 mice proved to be probably plague infected. The examination of 1 mouse was not completed.

ALGERIA.

Plague at Philippeville.

The following information is received through the Department of State from the American ambassador at Paris, under date of November 2:

Information is received from the Foreign Office, under date of October 28, 1907, that 3 cases of plague, 2 fatal, occurred at Philippeville, Algeria, between October 9 and 19.

All measures were taken to insure the destruction of rats. At Oran, since the isolation of a patient, effected October 14, to the date of the report, no new case of plague had been found and the bacteriological examinations made on rats had proved negative for 2 weeks.

A further report from the same source, dated November 5, was forwarded stating that new cases of plague were discovered on November 1 at Oran and November 4 at Philippeville.

AUSTRALIA.

Plague on coastwise steamship Mareeba at Brisbane—Examination of rodents at Brisbane, Cairns, and Sydney for plague infection—Plague at Cairns.

The following information is taken from plague bulletins issued by the departments of health of Queensland and New South Wales and forwarded by Consul-General Bray, at Melbourne:

QUEENSLAND.

Brisbane.—Week ended September 21. A steward on board the steamship *Mareeba*, a cargo vessel trading between Sydney and Rockhampton, was discovered to be suffering from plague on the arrival of the vessel at Brisbane on September 16. The patient was first taken ill on September 12, when the vessel was at New Castle, bound for Sydney. The ship arrived at Brisbane on September 16, and immediately after the case was discovered was quarantined in mid-stream. The patient was removed September 17, and the work of fumigation and disinfection of vessel and cargo was commenced. Seventy-eight dead rodents were found, of which 42 were probably plague-infected. All the rats found on the vessel were of the species *Mus Alexandrinus Rufus*. No other cases have been discovered.

During the week 359 rodents were destroyed, 274 examined, 2 found infected.

Week ended September 28. Plague case removed from steamship *Mareeba* died September 21. Rodents destroyed, 355; examined, 260; found infected, 2 on two separate premises.

Cairns.—Week ended September 21. Total number of rats found since outbreak 211, of which 37 were probably plague-infected, all of the *Mus Decumanus* species. The work of cleansing the town is still progressing.

Week ended September 28. A third case of plague was reported September 20; premises in vicinity of wharves. The case terminated fatally September 21. On September 23 a fourth case was reported in a Cingalese, who was found dead in his tent at Mulgrave, near Cairns, in the vicinity of the wharves. Total number of rodents destroyed since outbreak 43.

NEW SOUTH WALES.

Sydney.—Week ended September 21. Rodents destroyed, 1,922; examined, 502; found infected, 1.

Week ended September 28. Rodents destroyed, 1,800; examined, 421; found infected, 0. Date of last plague case May 19. Date of last infected rodent taken September 18; from fresh premises, September 5.

BRAZIL.

Reports from Rio de Janeiro—Inspection of vessels—Mortality—Plague and smallpox—Summary of plague, smallpox, and yellow fever, January 1 to October 24, 1907.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Stewart reports, October 9 and 24:

Week ended October 6. The following-named vessels were inspected and bills of health issued to them: October 3, the British steamship *Byron*, for New York, with cargo of coffee; 1 new member of the crew taken on here, 10 first-class and 8 steerage passengers; and the German steamship *Seiglinde*, for New York, with a cargo of coffee; 1 new member of the crew signed on here, and 7 first-class and 11 steerage passengers from this port. October 4, the Brazilian steamship *Sergipe*, for New York, with a full new crew signed on at this port, and with 15 first-class and 7 steerage passengers from this port.

Mortality report of city of Rio de Janeiro.—Week ended October 6. Total deaths, 218. There were no cases nor deaths due to yellow fever. Four new cases of bubonic plague were reported, with no deaths. Eleven new cases of smallpox were reported, with 3 deaths. At the close of the week there were in the Hospital São Sebastião no cases of yellow fever, 11 cases of smallpox, and 5 cases of bubonic plague. There was one death at Rio de Janeiro from leprosy.

Week ended October 20. The following-named vessels were inspected and bills of health issued: October 14, the British steamship *Border Knight*, for New York, with a cargo of coffee, no passengers, and no change in the personnel of the crew. October 15, the German steamship *Desterre*, for New Orleans, with a cargo of coffee, no passengers, and no change in crew personnel. October 17, the British steamship *Cober*, for some southern United States port, in water ballast, with no passengers, and no change in the personnel of the crew. October 19, the British steamship *Saxon Prince*, for New Orleans, with a cargo of coffee, no passengers, and no change in the crew personnel, and the British steamship *Voltaire*, for New York, with a cargo of coffee, 8 cabin and 14 steerage passengers from this port, and with no change in the personnel of the crew.

Mortality report from Bahia, Brazil.—Month of July, 1907. Total deaths, 385. No deaths from yellow fever or bubonic plague; 1 death from smallpox.

From January 1, 1907, to date there were 29 deaths from bubonic plague in Bahia and 3 from smallpox.

Mortality report of Rio de Janeiro.—Week ended October 20. Total deaths, 234. There were no cases nor deaths caused by yellow fever during the week. Bubonic plague caused 2 deaths; 5 new cases were reported. Smallpox caused 6 deaths, with 12 cases reported. At the close of the week there were in the Hospital São Sebastião no cases of yellow fever, 18 cases of smallpox, and 12 cases of plague. Since January 1 there have been in the city itself 38 deaths from yellow fever, 50 from bubonic plague, and 59 from smallpox.

CHINA.

Reports from Hongkong—Summaries of quarantine measures, August and September, 1907.

During this period the case under treatment since October 27, at La Benefica Hospital, was discharged, recovered, leaving Habana free of yellow fever. Nothing was developed as to the source of infection, either in this instance or in the 5 previous cases reported as originating in Habana during the current year.

The patient reported last week from Bainoa, Habana Province, has also been discharged, and the fumigating gangs, after several days' work in this settlement and Jaruco, have been dispatched to Alacranes and other infected points.

On November 16 the case of fever at Guines, this province, resulted fatally after four days' illness, the patient, as usual, being a Spaniard but a few months in the island.

At Los Palos the last patient was discharged November 9. Adjoining the district, however, in Matanzas Province, 1 yellow-fever case was confirmed November 15 at Alacranes.

At Ciego de Avila 2 further cases were reported during the week, both Americans, and in the city of Santa Clara 4 suspicious cases were isolated November 16.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Nuñez reports, November 12:

Week ended November 7:

The following vessels cleared for United States ports and were granted bills of health: November 3, the British barkentine *Hector*, having a crew of 10, no passengers, bound for Pascagoula, Miss., vessel fumigated; November 4, Spanish steamship *Ernesto*, with a crew of 21, no passengers, destined for Pensacola, Fla., fumigated; November 7, the Norwegian steamship *Ole Bull*, carrying a crew of 20, no passengers, destination Mobile, Ala., fumigated; and November 9, the British steamship *Castaño*, with 18 crew and 18 passengers in transit, leaving for an unknown port in the United States via Cuban ports.

No new cases of yellow fever have been reported either in the city or this province.

By direction of the chief of sanitation of Cuba, the local health officer of Matanzas has extended an official invitation to me to attend the meetings of the commission of infectious diseases, in order to cooperate in the diagnosis of each individual case.

The local sanitary officer of the rural town of Union de Reyes called at this office yesterday, and I was able to obtain the following data in reference to the 2 cases of yellow fever which were reported October 16 last, as occurring at a plantation colony known as Trinidad, in the vicinity of that town. One case, a male native of Cuba, had never left the island and had lived continuously in that district for the last eight years. The patient died, and at a necropsy held on the case the findings fully confirmed the nature of the disease. The other case, also a native of Cuba and sister of the above-mentioned patient, was taken sick two days after the first case. She was living in the same house and had never been out of the island. This case was of a mild form and recovered.

The origin of the infection in these two cases has not as yet been traced, although their residence is located within the known infected territory.

Week ended November 16: Bills of health were granted to 4 vessels bound for United States ports and the following vessels fumigated: November 15, the British steamship *Cayo Manzanillo*, with a crew of 35, and 2 passengers in transit, bound for Savannah, Ga. November 16, the Norwegian steamship *Times*, having 24 in the crew; no passengers; destination, Mobile, Ala. There was no sickness aboard either vessel up to the time of its inspection.

November 21. One new case of yellow fever confirmed to-day at Alacranes; Spanish woman 2 years in Cuba; occurred in the same house as previous case.

November 24. Case of yellow fever reported at Alacranes November 21; died to-day.

November 27. One case of yellow fever at Union de Reyes confirmed to-day.

Report from Santiago—Inspection of vessels.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Wilson reports, November 12:

Week ended November 9, 1907. Bills of health were issued to 3 vessels bound for the United States. No vessel was fumigated. No quarantinable disease was reported.

ECUADOR.

Report from Guayaquil—Summary for month of October, 1907—Smallpox and yellow fever—Fumigation of vessels—Vaccinations.

Passed Assistant Surgeon Lloyd reports, November 2:

During the month of October, 1907, there were in Guayaquil 6 deaths from smallpox. No deaths were reported from yellow fever during the month; 2 cases were reported from the lazaretto.

Eleven vessels were fumigated during the month and 28 persons vaccinated.

GERMANY.

Report from Berlin—Status of cholera in Russia.

The following is received from Consul-General Thackara, under date of November 4:

According to the official bulletins published by the imperial health office at Berlin, there were registered in the Russian Empire, during the period from October 9 to 19, inclusive, 1,657 cases of cholera and 608 deaths. Of these, 636 cases and 111 deaths occurred in the government district of Kief; 187 cases and 89 deaths in the middle Volga government districts of Simbirsk, Saratow, Penza, Kasan, and Nizhni-Novgorod; 111 cases and 52 deaths in the government districts of the lower Volga, Astrachan, Samara, and Orenburg; 146 cases and 80 deaths in the New Russian government districts of Ekaterinoslaw, the Don Kossak territory, and the town of Rostow; 39 cases and 16 deaths in the government districts of Tchernigow, Poltawa, and Charkow; 17 cases and 5 deaths in the government districts of Kostroma and Jaroslav; 3 cases and 3 deaths in the Ural government districts of Viatka and Ufa, and 6 cases and 3 deaths in the central agricultural districts of Kursk and Riazan. Furthermore, 35 cases and 9 deaths in the city of Baku in the southern Caucasus; 349 cases and 166 deaths in Siberia (Jenisseisk, Irkutsk, Tomsk, Tobolsk), and 128 cases and 65 deaths in Akmolinsk and Semipalatinsk.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Plague case at Glasgow.

According to a report from the Belgian legation at London, England, printed in the Bulletin Sanitaire, an official Belgian publication, a case of bubonic plague was discovered at Glasgow, Scotland, October 23, 1907, in a child 6 years old. The child had been ill

since October 17. The case was confirmed bacteriologically. A sister of the child, who, however, presented no symptoms of plague, worked at rag sorting.

HAWAII.

Report from Honolulu—Examination of rats for plague infection.

Passed Assistant Surgeon Currie reports that during the week ended November 2, 183 rats were examined bacteriologically at the plague laboratory of the Service at Honolulu. Plague infection was not proven in any of the rats examined.

INDIA.

Report from Calcutta—Transactions of Service—Cholera, plague, and smallpox—Plague in India and Bengal.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Eakins reports, October 24:

During the week ended October 12 a bill of health was issued to the steamship *Drachenfels*, bound for Boston and New York, with a total crew of 67. The usual precautions were taken, holds fumigated, rat guards placed on wharf lines, and Asiatics' effects disinfected.

Week ended October 19. No transactions.

During the week ended October 5 there were 23 deaths from cholera, 13 from plague, and 2 from smallpox in Calcutta.

In Bengal and India during the week ended October 5 there were 90 cases and 59 deaths from plague and 13,341 cases and 9,643 deaths from plague, respectively.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Tripler reports, October 30:

Week ended October 26. Bills of health were issued to 6 vessels, having an aggregate personnel of 1,067 passengers and 619 members of crews. Two of the vessels were bound for San Francisco via Honolulu, and one each for Manila, Guam, Honolulu, and Seattle.

In this district there were 4 new cases of cholera during the week ended October 26. In the Chiba and other districts a marked decrease is reported.

Emigrants recommended for rejection.

Number of emigrants per steamship *Amiral Exellmans* recommended, October 26, for rejection: For Honolulu, 3; advised to wait, 62.

Per steamship *Hongkong Maru*, October 30: For San Francisco, 2; advised to wait, 15. For Honolulu, advised to wait, 87.

Per steamship *Kaga Maru*, October 30: For Seattle, 2; advised to wait, 38.

Per steamship *Minnesota*, November 1: For Seattle, 2; advised to wait, 23.

Of these rejections and detentions all were for trachoma.

Report from Kobe—Inspection and fumigation of vessels—Inspection of emigrants—Improvement in cholera situation at Kobe—Smallpox—Status of plague at Osaka.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Ransom reports, October 23:

Week ended October 19, 1907. One original and 2 supplemental bills of health were granted to 3 steamships with an aggregate personnel of 770. There were inspected 3 vessels, 434 crew and 296 steerage passengers, and 37 members of crews and 151 steerage passengers were bathed and their effects disinfected. One steamship was fumigated to kill rats, etc. Manifests were viséed for 9,309 pieces of freight. Emigrants were examined as follows:

Steamship *Persia* for Honolulu and San Francisco: Passed 166, recommended for rejection, 107. Those passed were bathed and disinfected and held 5 days under observation prior to embarkation.

There was a marked improvement in the cholera situation at Kobe during the week, there having been but 20 cases and 12 deaths reported, as compared with 40 cases and 15 deaths last week. Seven cases of smallpox were reported.

There were reported from Osaka 20 cases and 21 deaths from plague during the week ended October 19. The cases were 8 less and the deaths 4 more than during the preceding week.

Plague still present at Osaka, November 19.

Information was received from the Department of State, November 19, that a telegram had been received from Kobe reporting plague at Osaka.

Report from Nagasaki—Emigrants recommended for rejection.

Sanitary Inspector Bowie reports:

October 22. Number of emigrants per steamship *Hongkong Maru* recommended for rejection, 17.

Quarantine at ports in Japan against Shanghai raised.

Sanitary Inspector Bowie further reports:

October 22. Quarantine heretofore placed by the Japanese Government on all vessels arriving at ports in this country within 5 days of their departure from Shanghai has been raised this day, the cholera epidemic being practically at an end both in China and Japan.

MEXICO.

Report from Veracruz—Inspection of vessels.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Frick reports, November 12:

Week ended November 9.

November 3. Inspected the Norwegian steamship *Kristiania*, bound for Galveston, with 30 in the crew; vessel sails in ballast. The *Kristiania* is the first vessel of a recently established Norwegian, Cuban, Mexican and Galveston Steamship Line to arrive at this port.

She was laden with the remainder of a Norwegian cargo the larger part of which was paper and paper wood pulp.

November 5. Inspected the British steamship *Framfield*, bound for New York via Mexican ports, with 24 in the crew; vessel sails in ballast. Inspected the British steamship *Skipton Castle*, bound for Galveston, with 30 in the crew; vessel sails in ballast.

November 6. Inspected the Norwegian steamship *Leander*, bound for Baltimore via Mexican ports, with 26 in the crew; vessel sails in ballast.

November 7. Inspected the British steamship *Bornu*, bound for Norfolk, for bunker coal, with 2 cabin and 21 steerage passengers; vessel sails in a general cargo for Montreal. Inspected the American steamship *Mexico*, bound for New York via Progreso and Habana; vessel sails in a general cargo, with 127 in the crew, 101 cabin and 56 steerage passengers.

November 9. Inspected the British steamship *Cedar Grove*, bound for New Orleans via Coatzacoalcos and Progreso, with 24 in the crew; vessel sails in the remainder of an American cargo.

No quarantinable disease was reported during the week.

PERU.

Report from Callao—Inspection and fumigation of vessel—Status of plague in Peru—Smallpox at Lima.

Assistant Surgeon Wightman reports, October 27:

Week ended October 26.

The British steamship *Panama* was dispatched October 25 for Ancon, Canal Zone, with general cargo and a total personnel of 211, of whom 8 members of crew 50 cabin and 23 steerage passengers were from this port. The steamer was fumigated before sailing.

Smallpox continues in Lima. No case of smallpox has been reported for Callao since August.

Bills of health from Chile do not report any change.

RUSSIA.

Report from St. Petersburg—Status of cholera.

The following information is received from the Department of State, under date of November 21:

A dispatch, dated November 1, from the American embassy at St. Petersburg states that, according to a communication received

from the foreign office, 1,072 cases of cholera, followed by 387 deaths, were reported between October 15 and 22, distributed throughout Russia. The Government of Kharkow, the dispatch adds, is declared threatened with the epidemic.

TUNIS.

Report from Tunis—Outbreak of plague.

Consul Proux reports, November 2:

Bubonic plague has broken out, owing to importation of fiber from Oran. The factory men have been attacked by the disease and several deaths have occurred. The factory has been destroyed by fire and no fresh cases of plague have occurred during the last 3 days.

WEST INDIES.

Yellow fever on the Island of Barbados.

Information was received from the Department of State, November 25, of the occurrence of 7 cases and 4 deaths of yellow fever on the Island of Barbados. Of these cases all but 1 were from the British cruiser *Indefatigable*. The *Indefatigable* sailed for Halifax.

FRANCE—*Calais.*—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 66,627. Total number of deaths, 113, including whooping cough 1 and 18 from tuberculosis.

Marseille.—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 517,498. Total number of deaths, 773, including diphtheria 6, enteric fever 41, measles 1, scarlet fever 3, smallpox 23, whooping cough 1, and 88 from tuberculosis.

St. Etienne.—Two weeks ended October 15, 1907. Estimated population, 150,000. Total number of deaths, 112, including whooping cough 1, enteric fever 1, and 15 from tuberculosis.

GIBRALTAR.—Two weeks ended November 10, 1907. Estimated population, 27,385. Total number of deaths, 11, including 1 from enteric fever.

GREAT BRITAIN—*England and Wales*.—The deaths registered in 76 great towns in England and Wales during the week ended November 2, 1907, correspond to an annual rate of 15.7 per 1,000 of population, which is estimated at 16,024,458.

London.—One thousand three hundred and ninety deaths were registered during the week, including measles 22, scarlet fever 22, diphtheria 21, enteric fever 2, whooping cough 18, tuberculosis 178, and 40 from diarrhea. The deaths from all causes correspond to an annual rate of 15.2 per 1,000. In Greater London 1,892 deaths were registered. In the "outer ring" the deaths included 5 from diphtheria, 4 from measles, 2 from scarlet fever, and 2 from whooping cough.

Ireland.—The average annual death rate represented by the deaths registered during the week ended November 2, 1907, in the 21 principal town districts of Ireland was 19 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,117,547. The lowest rate was recorded in Newry, viz, 4.2, and the highest in Armagh, viz, 41.2 per 1,000. In Dublin and suburbs 169 deaths were registered, including diphtheria 1, enteric fever 2, measles 1, scarlet fever 1, and 28 from tuberculosis.

Scotland.—The deaths registered in 8 principal towns during the week ended November 2, 1907, correspond to an annual rate of 16.4 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,812,171. The highest rate of mortality was recorded in Dundee, viz, 20.8, and the lowest in Perth, viz, 13.5 per 1,000. The aggregate number of deaths registered from all causes was 570, including diphtheria 9, enteric fever 2, measles 32, and 11 from whooping cough.

HAWAII—*Honolulu*.—Month of October, 1907. Census population, 39,306. Total number of deaths, 65, including diphtheria 1, enteric fever 1, and 13 from tuberculosis.

ITALY—*Genoa*.—Month of September, 1907. Estimated population, 273,011. Total number of deaths, 325, including enteric fever 8, diphtheria 1, scarlet fever 1, smallpox 1, and 53 from tuberculosis.

JAMAICA.—*Kingston*.—Month of October, 1907. Estimated population, 52,065. Total number of deaths, 109, including enteric fever 3, and 8 from phthisis pulmonalis.
