STATISTICAL REPORTS OF MORBIDITY AND MORTALITY, STATES AND CITIES  
OF THE UNITED STATES—UNTABULATED.

CALIFORNIA—*Stockton*.—Month of February, 1908. Estimated population, 23,000. Total number of deaths 20, including 2 from diphtheria. Five cases of diphtheria reported.

FLORIDA.—Reports from the State board of health for the week ended March 21, 1908, show as follows: Diphtheria—*St. Augustine*, 1 case. Enteric fever—*Tampa*, 4 cases; *Dade City*, *Fort White*, and *St. Petersburg*, each 1 case. Smallpox—*Tampa*, 1 case. Tuberculosis—*Bartow*, *Daytona*, *Sanford*, and *Tampa*, each 1 case; *Jacksonville*, 2 cases.

IOWA.—Reports to the State board of health for the month of October, 1907, show as follows: Total number of deaths, 1,636, including diphtheria 17, enteric fever 35, measles 1, scarlet fever 7, whooping cough 4, and 108 from tuberculosis.

Month of November, 1907. Total number of deaths 1,522, including diphtheria 24, enteric fever 25, measles 2, scarlet fever 7, whooping cough 5, and 109 from tuberculosis.

Month of December, 1907. Total number of deaths, 1,977, including diphtheria 26, enteric fever 19, measles 1, scarlet fever 4, whooping cough 4, and 117 from tuberculosis.

Month of January, 1908. Total number of deaths 2,216, including diphtheria 30, enteric fever 26, measles 5, scarlet fever 8, whooping cough 8, and 147 from tuberculosis.

NEW JERSEY—*Montclair*.—Year ended December 31, 1907. Estimated population 17,333. Total number of deaths 230, including enteric fever 1, measles 1, scarlet fever 1, whooping cough 5, and 26 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 24, enteric fever 20, measles 59, scarlet fever 30, whooping cough 24, and tuberculosis 35.

OHIO—*Canton*.—Month of February, 1908. Estimated population, 40,000. Total number of deaths not reported. Three deaths from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 5, scarlet fever 5, and tuberculosis 3.

PENNSYLVANIA—*Erie*.—Year ended December 31, 1907. Estimated population, 62,000. Total number of deaths, 976, including diphtheria 23, enteric fever 49, measles 10, whooping cough 2, and 82 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 132, enteric fever 316, measles 572, scarlet fever 225, smallpox 4, whooping cough 22, and tuberculosis 84.

RHODE ISLAND.—Month of November, 1907. Total number of deaths reported to the State board of health, 630, including 82 from tuberculosis. Cases of contagious diseases reported as follows: October 1907. Diphtheria 90, enteric fever 30, measles 26, and scarlet fever 38. November, 1907. Diphtheria 100, enteric fever 27, measles 49, and scarlet fever 59. December, 1907. Diphtheria 55, enteric fever 9, measles 106, and scarlet fever 59.

**TEXAS—Fort Worth.**—Month of February, 1908. Estimated population, 70,000. Total number of deaths, 80, including 1 from smallpox. Cases: Diphtheria 1, measles 26, scarlet fever 1, and smallpox 61.

**VIRGINIA.**—Reports to the State board of health for the month of February, 1908, show as follows:

Diphtheria present in 21 counties; enteric fever in 32 counties; measles in 47 counties; scarlet fever in 15 counties; whooping cough in 40 counties; smallpox in 18 counties, and tuberculosis in 69 counties.

**WEST VIRGINIA—Charleston.**—Month of February, 1908. Estimated population, 25,000. Total number of deaths, 31, including 3 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 2, enteric fever 1, measles 2, scarlet fever 1, and tuberculosis 3.

*Surgeon White detailed for duty in connection with the sanitation of Puerto Barrios, Guatemala.*

With the consent of the Guatemalan Government, obtained through the Department of State, Surg. J. H. White was detailed, March 11, to consult with the officials of the United Fruit Company at Puerto Barrios, Guatemala, relative to measures to be taken to sanitize that port.

*Passed Assistant Surgeon Lloyd authorized to assume duties of a sanitary director at Guayaquil, Ecuador.*

On the request of the Government of Ecuador, transmitted through the American minister at Quito, Passed Assistant Surgeon Lloyd was authorized, March 21, by the Secretary of the Treasury, to assume the duties of director of sanitary work to combat plague in the city of Guayaquil, Ecuador.

### CHINA.

*Report from Hongkong—Quarantine restrictions—Smallpox—Inspection of vessels.*

Acting Assistant Surgeon Hough reports, February 8: Week ended February 8. Restrictions enforced by Hongkong remain as reported on November 2. To restrictions enforced against Hongkong as reported on November 2 the following have been added:

Dutch Indies: Arrivals from Hongkong, or vessels having called there, are subject to 5 days' quarantine from date of departure or of last plague case on board. Importation is temporarily prohibited of animal refuse, claws and hoofs, animal or human hair and bristles, untanned hides and hides salted or cured with arsenic, raw wool and rags, bags or sacks which have already been used, coming from or transhipped at Hongkong; also tapestry and used embroideries unless they are transported as personal baggage or in consequence of change of residence.

Quarantinable disease: Smallpox, 46 cases, 29 deaths. Vessels inspected and granted bill of health, 6.

### COSTA RICA.

*Report from San José—Quarantine declared at Punta Arenas against Antofagasta, Chile, and Peruvian ports on account of plague.*

Consul Caldwell reports, February 29:

Owing to the existence of bubonic plague at Antofagasta, Chile, and in Peru, the Government of Costa Rica has declared quarantine at

Punta Arenas against these places. Vessels arriving from Antofagasta, or from Peruvian ports, must be thoroughly inspected on arrival at Punta Arenas, and if any case of plague has occurred during the voyage they are not to be allowed to enter the port or hold any communication with the shore or to land passengers or cargo. If no case has occurred, all cargo from said ports capable of conveying rats, as hay, straw, packing, etc., and also the baggage of passengers, must be at once disinfected at the pier.

## ECUADOR.

*Report from Quito—Plague officially recognized at Guayaquil—Precautionary measures to be taken at Quito.*

The following is received from Minister Fox, under date of February 25:

The existence of bubonic plague at Guayaquil has now been practically recognized officially.

This result has been reached because of the investigation by the board of sanitation, composed of some of the foremost physicians of this country. Measures are to be taken immediately at Quito for the prevention of plague.

A temporary hospital is to be constructed outside the town of Quito. The cremating oven at present existing is to be repaired. The market place is to be cleaned and repaired. The municipal force is to be increased. All medical men are required to report immediately any suspicious cases that may appear, under penalty in case of willful non-compliance. Circulars are to be profusely distributed, giving the people instruction respecting the sanitary measures they are to take in their own homes, including the extirpation of rabbits and guinea pigs. Inspectors ad honorem are to be appointed to make a house to house inspection. All organic matter in the rubbish heap is to be destroyed, and all refuse treated with abundant quantities of lime.

## HAWAII.

*Reports from Honolulu—Smallpox on steamship Nippon Maru from Hongkong.*

Chief Quarantine Officer Cofer reports, March 14:

The steamship *Nippon Maru* from Hongkong arrived yesterday with a case of smallpox on board in the person of a steerage passenger bound for San Francisco. The case and 100 contacts were placed in quarantine and all the steerage and crew's quarters were disinfected. The crew and through steerage passengers were bathed and their clothing disinfected. Everyone on board was vaccinated.

*Examination of rats for plague infection—Case of plague at Hilo previously reported bacteriologically confirmed.*

Passed Assistant Surgeon Currie, Plague Laboratory, reports, March 9 and 14:

During the week ended March 7, 199 rats were examined bacteriologically at the plague laboratory of the Service at Honolulu. No plague infection was found.

Week ended March 14: 173 rats examined bacteriologically at the plague laboratory of the Service at Honolulu. No plague infection found.

March 9: Complete bacteriological inquiry confirms the diagnosis of plague in the case of a Japanese child reported at Hilo, February 22. (*See Public Health Reports, March 6, 1908, page 285.*)

JAPAN.

*Reports from Yokohama—Inspection of vessels—Examination of emigrants—Smallpox—Summary of smallpox epidemic in Japan.*

Passed Assistant Surgeon Cumming reports, March 4:

Bills of health were issued during the week ended February 29 to 5 steamships inspected at this port, bound for ports in America

(2) and Manila (3). These vessels had an aggregate personnel of 61 saloon passengers, 256 steerage passengers, and 522 members of crews.

During the week 335 passengers and members of crews were bathed and 1,099 pieces of their baggage and effects were disinfected.

During the month of February, 464 intending steerage passengers for Hawaii and American ports on the mainland and 4 for Manila were inspected with reference to their freedom from diseases contemplated in the United States immigration laws, and of these, 4 were passed for Manila and 318 for Hawaii and United States ports.

Smallpox still persists here. Fifty-three cases, with 22 deaths, were reported during the week ended February 29. The local authorities state that they will have completed the vaccination of this city by the end of this week.

The present epidemic of smallpox has spread all over the Empire, and the aggregate number of cases is over 20,000.

In Yokohama to February 29, 371 cases, 111 deaths, and 115 recoveries were reported. No figures are given above for Fukuoka ken, but I am reliably informed that there is now an epidemic on both sides of the Shimonoseki Strait. The great coaling port of Moji in Fukuoka and, opposite, Shimonoseki in Yamaguchi ken, are important from a quarantine standpoint, as they are superseding Nagasaki as coaling ports. Many vessels coal there and take on cargo coal for America or the Philippines. The straits are only a few hundred yards wide at that point.

*Emigrants recommended for rejection.*

Number of emigrants per steamship *Kumeric* recommended February 26 for rejection: For Tacoma, 1; advised to wait, 4.

Per steamship *Nippon Maru*, March 3: For Honolulu, 3; advised to wait, 11.

Per steamship *Tango Maru*, March 4: For Seattle, 3; advised to wait, 25.

All of these rejections and detentions were for trachoma.

*Report from Kobe—Inspection of vessels—Examination of emigrants—Smallpox—Plague and smallpox at Osaka.*

Acting Assistant Surgeon Ransom reports, March 2:

During the week ended February 29, 5 supplemental bills of health were granted to 5 steamships, having an aggregate personnel of 816.

There were inspected 5 vessels, 457 members of crews, 12 cabin and 313 steerage passengers. One member of crew and 231 steerage passengers were bathed and their effects were disinfected by steam. There were steamed 661 pieces of personal effects. Vaccination certificates were issued to 276 persons. Manifests were viséed for 16,266 pieces of freight.

Emigrants were examined as follows: Steamship *Kumeric*, for Tacoma, passed, 10; recommended for rejection, 10; steamship *Nippon Maru*, for Honolulu, passed, 81; recommended for rejection, 68; steamship *Tango Maru*, for Seattle, passed, 85; recommended for rejection, 80.

The official report of communicable diseases in Kobe for the week shows 140 new cases of smallpox, with 65 deaths. The total deaths from all causes reported numbered 230.

The total number of officially reported cases of smallpox in Kobe since the commencement of the epidemic, up to and including February 28, was 5,038, with 2,105 deaths.

Reports from Osaka for the week ended February 22, show plague, 4 cases with 4 deaths; smallpox, 189 new cases with 62 deaths. There were 48 new cases of smallpox reported in Osaka and suburbs on February 26, making a total number of 1,171 cases reported since the commencement of the epidemic in that city.

***London*.**—One thousand five hundred and eighty deaths were registered during the week, including measles 29, scarlet fever 10, diph-

theria 21, enteric fever 2, whooping cough 29, tuberculosis 179, and 16 from diarrhea. The deaths from all causes correspond to an annual rate of 17.2 per 1,000. In Greater London 2,238 deaths were registered. In the "outer ring" the deaths included 1 from measles, 3 from scarlet fever, 5 from diphtheria, and 4 from whooping cough.

*Ireland.*—The average annual death rate represented by the deaths registered during the week ended March 7, 1908, in the 21 principal town districts of Ireland was 27.2 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,131,959. The lowest rate was recorded in Galway, viz, 15.5, and the highest in Tralee, viz, 47.6 per 1,000.

*Scotland.*—The deaths registered in 8 principal towns during the week ended March 7, 1908, correspond to an annual rate of 19.3 per 1,000 of the population, which is estimated at 1,839,038. The highest rate of mortality was recorded in Dundee, viz, 22.0, and the lowest in Edinburgh, viz, 15.9 per 1,000. The aggregate number of deaths registered from all causes was 681, including diphtheria 6, enteric fever 3, measles 47, scarlet fever 7, and 18 from whooping cough.

*MEXICO—Tampico.*—Two weeks ended March 15, 1908. Estimated population, 20,000. Total number of deaths, 44, including 6 from tuberculosis.
