Statistics of plague in California.

Total cases of plague at San Francisco verified bacteriologically to May 16, 121; total cases verified clinically, 38; total deaths, 77. The last case at San Francisco was taken sick January 30 and confirmed by bacteriological examination as plague February 8, 1908. Date of finding of last plague-infected rat, May 23.

The last case at Oakland, Cal., died December 22, 1907. The last plague-infected rats at Oakland were found during the week ended April 11, 1908. The only case at Berkeley, Cal., died September 1, 1907. The only case at Point Richmond, Cal., was taken sick November 27, 1907, and recovered.

OF THE UNITED STATES—UNTABULATED.

FLORIDA.—Reports from the State board of health for the week ended May 23, 1908, show as follows: Enteric fever—*Jacksonville*, 4 cases; *Tampa*, 3 cases; *Daytona*, 2 cases; *Lloyd*, 1 case. Diphtheria—

Jacksonville, 1 case. Tuberculosis—*Jacksonville*, 4 cases; *Tampa*, 3 cases.

ILLINOIS.—Year ended December 31, 1907. Total number of deaths reported, 62,854, including diphtheria 1,015, enteric fever 1,119, measles 413, scarlet fever 880, smallpox 5, whooping cough 530, and 7,142 from tuberculosis.

IOWA—*Keokuk*.—Month of April, 1908: Estimated population, 16,000. Total number of deaths, 18, including enteric fever 1, whooping cough 1, and 1 from tuberculosis. Cases: Enteric fever 20, whooping cough 1, and scarlet fever 2.

MINNESOTA—*St. Paul*.—Month of April, 1908. Estimated population, 220,000. Total number of deaths reported to the department of health, 212, including diphtheria 1, scarlet fever 3, enteric fever 2, measles 1, whooping cough 3, and 27 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 38, measles 65, scarlet fever 47, and smallpox 59.

OHIO—*East Liverpool*.—Month of April, 1908. Estimated population, 20,000. Total number of deaths, 25, including enteric fever 1, and 3 from tuberculosis. Cases: Enteric fever 1, diphtheria 2, and tuberculosis 3.

PENNSYLVANIA—*Johnstown*.—Two weeks ended May 23, 1908. Estimated population, 65,000. Total number of deaths, 25, including enteric fever 1, and 1 from scarlet fever. Cases: Diphtheria 6, measles 64, scarlet fever 4, whooping cough 18, and tuberculosis 2.

SOUTH CAROLINA—*Charleston*.—Month of January,^a 1908. Estimated population, 65,000. Total number of deaths, 121, including enteric fever 1, and tuberculosis 17. Cases: Diphtheria 2, enteric fever 7, and scarlet fever 1.

Month of February,^a 1908. Total number of deaths 124, including enteric fever 2, whooping cough 1, and 19 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 3 and enteric fever 3.

Month of March,^a 1908. Total number of deaths 116, including enteric fever 1, whooping cough 1, and 16 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 4, enteric fever 2, and scarlet fever 1.

UTAH.—Month of April, 1908. Reports to the State board of health from 27 counties, having an estimated population of 346,873, show as follows: Total number of deaths 365, including diphtheria 10, enteric fever 3, measles 6, scarlet fever 2, whooping cough 2, and 8 from tuberculosis. Cases: Diphtheria 74, enteric fever 30, measles 621, scarlet fever 161, smallpox 43, whooping cough 77, and tuberculosis 15 (incomplete).

BARBADOS.

Report from Bridgetown—Inspection of vessels.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Urquhart reports, May 16:

BRAZIL.

Report from Rio de Janeiro—Inspection of vessels—Campaign against tuberculosis recommended by Federal authority—Mortality—Small-pox.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Stewart reports, May 6:

Week ended May 6. Vessels received bills of health: April 30, the British steamship *Phidias*, for New Orleans, with a cargo of coffee, no passengers, and no change in the crew personnel; on the same date the Brazilian steamship *Goyaz*, for New York, with a cargo of coffee for the United States and miscellaneous cargo for intermediate Brazilian ports, 17 cabin and 7 steerage passengers for intermediate Brazilian ports and for the United States, and with the entire crew signed on in this port, it being the ship's home port; May 2, the British steamship *Tennyson*, for New York, with a cargo of coffee, 8 cabin and 10 steerage passengers, and with one member of the crew returned to the ship in this port from hospital, where he had been left by the vessel on its way to Santos from New York; on the same date the chartered Brazilian Lloyd steamship *Brantwood*, for New York, in cargo of coffee, with no passengers, and with one new member of the crew. All vessels were inspected by me just prior to sailing with the exception of the steamship *Brantwood*.

Remarks of the President of the Republic in relation to public health.—In the annual message of the President of the Republic to Congress the President states his satisfaction with the present sanitary work in the Federal district, and urges the necessity of modernizing and extending the means of sanitary education, and asks that there be inaugurated against tuberculosis a regularly organized campaign similar to that carried on against yellow fever and bubonic plague.

Mortality report for city of Rio de Janeiro.—Week ended May 3. Total population, 628,675. Total deaths, 341. No deaths nor cases due to either yellow fever or bubonic plague. Smallpox caused 62 deaths, with 123 new cases reported. At the close of the week there were in the Hospital São Sebastião 181 cases of smallpox under treatment.

No cases of either yellow fever or plague were in the hospital.

During this period 284 persons en route for southern ports, and who had undergone the required six days' detention in Habana, were provided with Service certificates. In addition 124 certificates were issued to passengers bound for New York.

In the interior of Cuba, beyond a few heavy rainfalls at widely separated points, drought continues. In Habana there has been no rain for weeks.

Report from Matanzas—Inspection of vessels—Case of leprosy previously reported transferred to Habana—One case of leprosy remaining.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Nuñez reports, May 25:

Week ended May 23. Bills of health were granted to two steamships clearing for the United States in good sanitary condition. There were no vessels fumigated during the week. No quarantinable diseases have been reported.

The case of leprosy mentioned in one of my previous reports as not being disposed of has been transferred to Habana, there to be segregated at the San Lazaro Hospital. There is but one case remaining isolated at home, at the district of Versalles, by authority of the sanitary department.

Report from Santiago—History of yellow fever case previously reported.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Wilson reports, May 21:

The following is the history of the case of yellow fever reported May 18 [see Public Health Reports, May 22, 1908, page 699]:

Patient 21 years old, a Spaniard, 5 years' resident on the island of Cuba. April 7 he arrived from Guantanamo, remained in Santiago eight or ten days, then embarked for Santo Domingo. May 7 he left Santo Domingo by the Cuban steamship *Julia*, arriving at Santiago May 9. May 12 he was taken ill and May 15 went to the civil hospital. May 17 the diagnosis of yellow fever was made by the committee on infectious diseases. They pronounced it a mild, but unmistakable, attack of yellow fever.

ECUADOR.

Report from Quito—Railway traffic suspended between Huigra and Alausi to prevent spread of plague.

The following is received from Minister Fox under date of April 24:

In order to prevent the spread of plague from Guayaquil into the interior of Ecuador all traffic has been suspended upon the railway between Huigra and Alausi. The former place is the headquarters of the railway and the location of the hospital. Patients discovered on trains are put off at this point, and on this account more cases are reported from there than elsewhere, except from the port of Guayaquil.

Orders have been issued to burn all houses in Huigra found to be infected, and a sanitary cordon has been established between Huigra and Alausi, and all communication between these points has been suspended for ten days.

HAWAII.

Report from Honolulu—Examination of rodents for plague infection.

Passed Assistant Surgeon Currie reports through Chief Quarantine Officer Cofer that, during the week ended May 9, 379 rats were examined bacteriologically at the plague laboratory of the Service at Honolulu. No plague infection found.

HONDURAS.

Report from Ceiba, fruit port—Mosquito destruction.

Acting Assistant Surgeon Jumel reports:

Week ended May 19. Present officially estimated population, 6,500. General sanitary condition of this port and the surrounding country during the week, good. The liberal use of crude oil and the small rainfall during the past month have resulted in the destruction of innumerable mosquitoes in their larval state. *Culex*, *Anopheles*, and *Stegomyia* still exist in this port, but are not as abundant as formerly.

Bills of health were issued to the following-named vessels:

Passed Assistant Surgeon Cumming reports, May 6:

During the week ended May 2 bills of health were issued to 8 steamships, having an aggregate personnel of 883 members of crews, 375 saloon and 750 steerage passengers. Of these vessels, 2 were bound for San Francisco, 2 for Manila, 3 for Seattle, and 1 for Gaviota, Cal.

The members of the crew of the oil-tank steamship *Soyo Maru* bound for Gaviota were bathed and vaccinated. Their effects were disinfected and the forecastle of the vessel was cleaned. The *Den of Airlie* and *Kumano Maru* for Manila were fumigated on account of previous ports visited and crew of former (except 8) vaccinated.

The health of this community is very good, and the spring housecleaning by the authorities continues. One case of cholera is reported to-day in Gumma ken, just north of Tokyo-fu, and one case of smallpox in Hiroshima.

VENEZUELA.

Report from Caracas—Carupano and Cristobal Colon declared open to foreign export and import.

The following is received from Minister Russell, under date of May 7:

May 3 the governor of Trinidad issued a decree declaring Venezuela infected and subjecting all vessels with passengers or cargo from any port in the Republic to a quarantine not to exceed 10 days. In view of the above-mentioned decree the executive of Venezuela has issued a decree declaring Carupano and Cristobal Colon open ports for foreign export and import to and from Ciudad Bolivar.

La Guaira declared open to traffic from May 25.

The following is received from the American minister, through the Department of State, under date of May 23:

The Government of Venezuela issued to-day a decree stating that eight days having elapsed without a new case having appeared of the epidemic which existed at La Guaira, the said port will be open to traffic with the United States and Europe from May 25, and coastwise and interior traffic from May 29.

London.—One thousand two hundred and seventy-three deaths were registered during the week, including measles 38, scarlet fever 10, diphtheria 6, whooping cough 22, enteric fever 1, tuberculosis 165, and 11 from diarrhea. The deaths from all causes correspond to an annual rate of 13.8 per 1,000. In Greater London 1,821 deaths were registered. In the "outer ring" the deaths included 9 from measles, 5 from scarlet fever, 1 from smallpox, 4 from diphtheria, and 4 from whooping cough.
